

UNIVERSITY OF NOTTINGHAM

The University of Nottingham have had an incredible season within BUCS, taking home 3 BUCS titles including: Men's National Championship, Women's National Trophy and Men's Individual Championship (Phoenix Weir) along with 3 runners-up including: National League and Men's & Women's Doubles Championship (Dominik Kellovsky & Phoenix Weir and Katie Andreini & Madison Kane).

The Men's 1st Team made history by winning the Men's National Championship for the first time since 1954.



LOUGHBOROUGH UNIVERSITY WHEELCHAIR TENNIS

The Loughborough University Wheelchair Tennis team had a very successful run at this year's Wheelchair Tennis Championships. The team of 7 took home an impressive 9 medals in total.

Loughborough student & Paralympian, Abbie Breakwell sealed her 5th consecutive BUCS title in the Women's Singles before teaming up with Joe Court in the Mixed Doubles to add another gold to her collection.



LOUGHBOROUGH UNIVERSITY ELIZ MALONEY

Loughborough first-year Eliz Maloney had a standout debut season, winning all 4 available titles: Premier (National) League, National Championship, BUCS Doubles Championship (with Megan Davies) and BUCS Individual Championship.

Eliz also made her international debut in the GB Students team, securing silver at the Master'U BNP Paribas Championships, represented GB Students at the World University Games and was named BUCS Sportswoman of the Year.





OUR 2025-26 PRIORITIES

MINIMUM OPERATING STANDARDS (MOS)

Further develop the MOS to strengthen the Premier (National) League, supporting institutional delivery with the aim of continuing to improve standards across the league.

Continue collaborative work with the ITIA and LTA to provide anti-doping and anti-corruption education for students, promoting integrity and safeguarding the sport.

SOCIAL MEDIA/COMMUNICATIONS

Continue to raise the profile and influence of BUCS Tennis through social media output on sites such as Instagram.

Improve communication streams with students by creating a GB University Tennis Network WhatsApp Community.

WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT

Support the delivery of subsidised/free training for Competition Organisers, University Tennis Activators, Student Referees, and Line/Chair Umpires, while establishing a clear workforce development pathway.

Continue to recruit and engage student volunteers in key roles at BUCS Tennis events, including media, event support, and officiating.

RECREATIONAL OFFER

Promote LTA initiatives and products such as Play Your Way to Wimbledon and Box Leagues to enhance the student tennis experience and provide accessible, competitive opportunities for recreational players and those not currently involved in BUCS competitions.

RECORDED RESULTS

Ensure BUCS Tennis results are accurately recorded on both BUCS Play and the LTA's Online League Planner, enabling results to contribute to each student's World Tennis Number (WTN) and supporting the LTA's goal of increasing the number of results submitted towards WTN.

IMPROVEMENTS TO DOUBLES CHAMPIONSHIPS

To enhance the student experience, a consolation draw will be introduced at the BUCS Doubles Championships. This will ensure all pairs are guaranteed a minimum of two matches, supporting greater inclusivity and ensuring meaningful competitive opportunities for all participants.
