	Please note, the competition rules for the <b>postal</b> team league state that shooters with the highest averages are placed in the 'A team', the next highest in the 'B' team and so on.

Calculation Of Averages	Individuals and Team Members need to submit their most recent Short/Long Range Average when entering on BUCS Play. This is calculated by using the best 10 of 12 last cards shot, or best 5 of 6 last cards shot. This should fall within the parameter range of 50.0 – 100.0.
	If Individuals and/or Team Members are unable to supply an average before the entries close, then they must email The NSRA Competitions Department ( <a href="mailto:competitions@nsra.co.uk">competitions@nsra.co.uk</a> ) supplying the average(s) within one week of entries closing.
	Any supplied averages that are presumed to be fabricated, will result in The NSRA Competition Department & BUCS for evidence of the supplied average and may request for a reshoot to calculate a new supplied average.
	The definition of a novice is as followed:
Novices	Competitors who have not previously fired in organised, civilian, police or military smallbore rifle competitions, regardless of the course of fire composing such matches. They have also never fired a gun or has for fun but has never been formally taught anything about marksmanship.
	If there is any uncertainty, then The NSRA Competitions Department can assess eligibility on an individual basis. If you would like The NSRA Competitions Department to assess eligibility, please email <u>competitions@nsra.co.uk</u> .
	Any decision by the NSRA regarding whether someone is a novice or not is final.
	All shooters, team captains and witnesses must also familiarise themselves with the NSRA Rules & Regulations for Postal & Shoulder-to-shoulder competitions. These can be found at: <u>https://www.nsra.co.uk/rules-information</u> under the section 'Competition Information & Rules'.
	PARTICULARLY:
	Rule 7.4.10.1.1 – stickers must be affixed to the cards before shooting.
NSRA Rules &	Rule 7.4.10.1.2 – the shooter must be correctly named on each card, either on the sticker or written in block capitals.
Regulations	Rule 7.4.2 – The <b>only</b> thing that a shooter should be doing after shooting is signing the cards – <b>nothing else</b> .
	Witnesses must be qualified to act as a witness under <b>Rule 7.5.2</b> and must be fully conversant with their duties under <b>Rule 7.6.</b>
	Rule 7.6.3.1 - the witness checks that the shooter has signed the card after shooting.
	<b>Rule 7.6.3.2</b> - the <b>witness</b> signs and <b>dates the card</b> with the date of shooting <b>after</b> the card has been shot (and, de facto, signs that they have actually witnessed the shoot).

Course Of Fire	Postal Competition of 5 rounds, 10 shots per team member/individual per round, leading to Team & Individual Finals. Once the qualifying stages have been completed the <b>top 8 teams</b> will be invited to the finals. The <b>top 12 men, top 12 women</b> and <b>top 6 novice shooters</b> taken from the individual Championships will be invited to attend these finals also.	
Competitions	Individual: Men's Championship Women's Championship Novice Championship <u>University Teams:</u> Mixed* Team of 6 (Team of 6) *Any 'mixed' teams can comprise of a team of all Women or all Men. It is not a requirement to have a 'mix' of Women & Men.	
	QUALIFIER - POSTAL	
Stickers	<ol> <li>The identification of competition targets will be by means of adhesive stickers. One sticker will be issued for each target to be shot in a competition.</li> <li>Upon receipt of the competition stickers, please check these carefully and notify the NSRA Competitions Department within 14 days of any discrepancies or queries. Unless specified otherwise, cards may be shot upon receipt of stickers and must be shot in round number order.</li> <li>It is recommended that all stickers are affixed to targets at the beginning of the competition, and as soon as possible after receipt. Once affixed to a target, stickers should not be removed.         If you have applied stickers to incorrect targets for the competition, please contact the NSRA Competitions Department for advice on how to proceed.     </li> <li>Where paper targets are used, as outlined in section 7.4.10 of the Rules and Regulations, competition stickers are to be affixed to the match card before it is shot.</li> <li>If electronic targets are used, competition stickers must be attached to the record strip/score sheet as set out in section 7.4.11 of the Rules and Regulations.</li> <li>Where concurrent shooting is taking place, all relevant stickers must be affixed to the same card/record strip/score sheet.</li> </ol>	
Last Day For Shooting / Shoot By Date	Shooting may commence upon receipt of the competition stickers and must be completed by the published "Last Day For Shooting"/"Shoot By Date". It is possible to shoot ahead, and you could even shoot all of the cards within the space of a few days.	

	If you have shot your cards ahead of the schedule, please send them off early. The quicker we can get the cards in from you, the easier to get the results out to you.
After Shooting	In accordance with Rule 7.4.2, unless specified otherwise, the competitor must add their signature to each card/record upon completing the shoot to certify compliance with all the rules and conditions applied to the competition.
	Every shoot must be witnessed. Therefore, it is the responsibility of the competitor or team captain to ensure that an appropriately qualified witness for the specific competition being shot is available at the time of shooting and that the shoot is properly witnessed.
	Unless specified otherwise, a person who meets the criteria listed in section 7.5 of the NSRA Rules and Regulations is qualified to witness the shoot.
Witnessing	The witness must comply with the duties specified in section 7.6 of the NSRA Rules and Regulations. In particular, they should sign and date each card after the competitor has signed the card and in doing so confirm that the rules/conditions of the competition have been complied with.
	Special requirements apply to the witnessing of competitions shot on electronic targets - see Rule 7.4.11
	Any variation from the conditions of shooting shall be noted by the witness on the relevant cards or certificate and drawn to the attention of the scorer. The witness shall similarly report any other relevant occurrence such as cross-shooting, allowable pistol malfunctions resulting in excess shots on a card, and accidental damage to a card.
Concurrent Shooting	If you have entered both the Individual Championship and the League competition, the competitor may shoot these concurrently. In other words, the competitor may place the sticker for the Individual Championship on the same card as that of the League.
	However, the competitor must be careful to shoot your cards in the correct order and stick the same round on the same card. I.e., Round 1 for the team league may be shot with Round 1 of the individual and this must be shot before round 2 and so on.
	A substitute may be included in any team competition but are not permissible in individual competitions. A replacement shooter must already be entered into the event on BUCS Play, i.e. they must be entered into the Individual Championship. You are unable to use somebody completely new that has not been entered or verified by your athletic union.
Substitutes	If a team member is being replaced by a substitute, the team captain must inform the NSRA Competitions Department of the name and current average of the substitute/reserve before shot cards are posted to the designated central scorer.
	In the event of a substitute being used for a registered competitor, the name of the substitute shall be added to the card and the name of the registered competitor may be struck through but must remain readable.
	NSRA scoring rules apply to this Competition.
Scoring	This Competition is not eligible for local scoring. Therefore, the designated Central Scorer <b>must</b> be used. Failure to use the designated Central Scorer will result in disqualification from the competition.
	Estimated scores cannot be written on competition cards.
Control Scorers	Details of the designated Central Scorer for the relevant competitions are sent with the stickers & paperwork to the competitor/team captain by the NSRA Competitions Department.
Central Scorers	Cards must be received by the Central Scorer by the date specified on the paperwork or as advised by the NSRA Competitions Department.

	Cards arriving after the specified date will not be scored, unless the package carries a postmark showing that it was posted within one day of the last day for shooting that round.
	Incorrectly addressed cards will not be forwarded to the correct Central Scorer and therefore no score will be recorded. <b>Please ensure that each package bears the correct postage</b> , as Central Scorers are not obligated to pay to collect from a Postal Sorting Office. Therefore, failure to ensure the package bears the correct postage may result in no score being recorded.
	Where a Central Scorer chooses to pay the surcharge to collect an item, the competitor/team captain will be responsible for reimbursing the full cost incurred by the Central Scorer. Payment must be received within 14 days of notification, otherwise the competitor/team will have their score disqualified.
	Do <b>not</b> use recorded or special delivery, as this adds extra inconvenience for Central Scorers. Furthermore, please do not staple multiple cards together when sending them to a Central Scorer.
	It is advisable to obtain an official printed proof of posting from the Post Office, in case shot cards get lost in the post. Upon production of this evidence, which shows the cards were sent to the correct Central Scorer and in good time before the last date the cards were to be received, a re-shoot will be granted by the Competitions Department. An official proof of posting should have the building name or number and the postcode.
	Central Scorers are volunteers who support NSRA postal competitions in their spare time. They are often responsible for several competitions. Please treat them with respect and do not involve them in letter writing. All correspondence must be sent to the NSRA Competitions Department, <u>competitions@nsra.co.uk</u> .
	The NSRA's Online Results Portal (ORP) will be used to publish results, which can be viewed via the following link: <a href="https://results.nsra.co.uk">https://results.nsra.co.uk</a>
Results	and will appear the day after the "Round End Date" stated on the ORP (this is not the "Last Day For Shooting").
	From time to time there may be some delay in the issue of results when Headquarters staff are engaged in work connected with the National Meetings.
Challenges	Challenges must be made in writing by emailing the Competitions Department ( <u>competitions@nsra.co.uk</u> ). Challenges are to be made by the competitor and/or the team captain. If the challenge is not successful, a <b>£3.00</b> challenge fee per competitor per round/stage must be paid. Payment must be received within 14 days of notification, otherwise the competitor/team will have their score disqualified.
	Challenges must be raised within 14 days of publication of the results.
Disciplinary	Failure to comply with the relevant NSRA Rules and Regulations or the General Rules applicable to any competition render a competitor's card or cards liable to disqualification.
Action	Dishonest, discreditable or dangerous conduct will be dealt with in accordance with the provisions of NSRA Rules and Regulations and with BUCS.

Conduct Of Shooting	STICKER APPLICATION IS TO BE OBSERVED AND STRUCK THROUGH BY RANGE OFFICERS OR NSRA STAFF, IF YOU DO NOT COMPLY, YOU WILL BE DISQUALIFIED.	
	The squadding plan, the draw and the timetable are shown on the Main Noticeboard. All competitors are to ensure that their name and university are written on each card. If the	
	competition includes more than one card in each round, cards are to be annotated 1, 2, etc.	
Squadding	Team Captains are to ensure that their team members understand and apply the squadding system shown on the Main Noticeboard.	
Squuunig	Within the Team Final, you may use an eligible substitute if you find that one of your team members is unable to shoot. A replacement shooter must already be entered into the event on BUCS Play, i.e. they must be entered into any of the three Individual Competitions or be from one of your other teams, they do not need to be someone who is competing in the Individual Final. You are unable to use somebody completely new that has not been entered or verified by your athletic union.	
	Times are as follows: 30 minutes is allowed for each detail.	
	i. Minutes 0 - 10 - Match card including sighters.

International Team	The International Match is the team match held immediately following the final detail of the individual competition. The match is between home countries (England, Scotland and Wales), in recent years only England & Scotland have competed.  CAPTAINS: Each team has a captain, selected, and agreed by all present during the captains meeting on the day of the match. The captain is free to make his selection as he pleases from the available firers on the day.  TEAM MEMBERS Each team has 10 members*. Members are selected for teams based on the university they attend, irrespective of their nationality. I.e. An English student studying at Edinburgh would be eligible for the Scotland team in the match.  COURSE OF FIRE 20 shots at 50m.  *In the event that all three countries are competing (England, Scotland & Wales) this goes down to 8 team members due to range capacity.
Rules	The meeting will be run under the rules of the National Small-Bore Rifle Association (NSRA) and of British Universities And Colleges Sport (BUCS). Where there is a conflict between these rules, the latter will apply.
Conduct Of Shooting	STICKER APPLICATION IS TO BE OBSERVED AND STRUCK THROUGH BY RANGE OFFICERS OR NSRA STAFF, IF YOU DO NOT COMPLY, YOU WILL BE DISQUALIFIED.

	The competition is not squadded.
	Each University is allocated adequate firing points for the number of shooters they have brought to complete the competition in the time allowed.
	Team Captains can allocate firing points as they wish from those allocated to the university.
Detail Timings &	The first detail starts at 09:00 and the final detail at 16:30.
Squadding	Two 30-minute details at each distance.
	20 minutes to shoot the 20 shots including unlimited sighters and 10 minutes to change targets.
	Any number of sighters may be fired but the time limit per detail will not be exceeded.
	All competitors are to ensure that their name and university are written on each card. If the competition includes more than one card in each round, cards are to be annotated 1, 2, etc.
	All team competitions are shot concurrent with the individual competition(s).
	Each competitor will shoot four details of four cards (40 shots at 50 metres and 40 shots at 100 yards)

Individual Competitions	Each competitor will shoot four details of four cards (40 shots at 50 metres and 40 shots at 100 yards), giving an individual total of 800.
	All team competitions (Team Championship, Invitation Quartet, Invitation Pairs & Invitation Ladies Triad) are all shot concurrently with the individual competition, so coaching is not allowed under NSRA Rules:
	6.9.6 Only shooters actually firing and officials are allowed on the firing point except in those team competitions where coaching is permitted.
Coaching	6.9.7 In individual competitions, shooters may spot for themselves. Spotting assistance by others is not permitted.
	6.9.8 In team competitions which require the whole of a team to shoot together, each team member may spot for himself. No individual competition shall be shot concurrently. If provided for in the rules of the competition, coaches must be nominated to the Range Officer, in advance. Coaches are not permitted to load, adjust sights or to touch the rifle or pistol in any way.
	The only exception to these rules is the International Match where coaching is permitted.
