3. BUCS Update <ul style="list-style-type: none"> A meeting is scheduled with Basketball England (NK) to discuss affiliations and representation. Female participation and affiliation in university basketball compares very positively to the national picture. The group agreed this represents a strong good-news story for student sport and women's basketball. <p>Action: Explore promotion of Female statistics with BUCS digital team.</p>	HU
4. 3X3 Development <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Ongoing discussions within BUCS regarding formal integration of 3x3. Potential desire to work with Ball Out 3x3, either in partnership or delivering for us. Desire for events to generate FIBA 3x3 Points/Rankinga 	HU/JM

Using Nick's amendments I have made a slight tweak to the wording - we have some inconsistencies about where they are called licence card v membership card but the predominate wording seems to be membership card. Using the wording for 2.2.2 have also added similar to 8.3.

Happy for this to be checked and challenged.

"BAS 2.2 Licensing of Coaches and Players"

BAS 2.2.1 All players and coaches must hold a valid licence issued via the relevant NCB as per the requirements of the BUCS Sport Specific Affiliations Document.
BAS 2.2.2 Before each match, teams must present to the Match Officials the licences of all players and coaches who are to participate in the match. For Premier Tier/National Championship matches, in the event of a valid licence not being produced for a player or coach, that person shall not be permitted to participate in the match in question. For all other matches, players and coaches unable to present a valid licence at a fixture should be noted on the scoresheet but are able to participate, however, any institution/Playing Entity found to have fielded any player(s) and/or coach(es) without the appropriate licensing in place will face sanctions as outlined in the BUCS Sport Specific Affiliations Document.

Please note: Basketball England have "digital membership cards". To meet the requirements of BAS 2.2.2, an individual must be able to present an active membership card using the HoopsHQ app. This should be shown on the day via HoopsHQ but a screenshot can be accepted. These players and coaches will not have a licence number to be recorded on the scoresheet.

"BAS 8.3 Before each match, all Match Officials must present their licence card if requested by the teams involved.

Please note: Basketball England have "digital membership cards". To meet the requirements of BAS 8.3, an official must be able to present an active membership card using the HoopsHQ app. These officials will not have a licence number to be recorded on the scoresheet.

Referee Fees

- Widespread concern about regional "bidding wars" for referees.
- Recognition of disparities across institutions and regions.
- Discussion of potential tier-based fee structures, aligned loosely with National League benchmarks.
- Acknowledged that any changes would be for future seasons, not the current one.
- JM to include referee fees as a discussion point in the upcoming institutional framework conversations.
