Main purpose of role British Universities & Colleges Sport (BUCS) is seeking to appoint a

highly qualified and experienced volunteer Chief Physiotherapist to lead physiotherapy support and delivery for the GB Students delegation due to compete at the Winter World University Games in

2025.

The successful applicant will take the role for a World University Games cycle, from appointment through to the end of the Games. The successful candidate will also be encouraged to support the

BUCS domestic programme during their tenure.

The FISU Winter World University Games are staged biennially as a celebration of international university sports and culture. The FISU Winter World University Games is considered the second largest multi-sport Winter Games in the world to the Winter Olympics. The

Games represent an experience comparable to an Olympic,

Paralympic & Commonwealth Games in terms of scale, village life and

competition format.

The next Games are due to be held in Torino and four other municipalities in the region including Bardonecchia and Pragelato for

snow sports, and Torre Pellice and Pinerolo

It is anticipated that the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland will send a delegation of around 50-75 to the FISU

Winter World University Games 2025.

MAIN DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

- To lead and provide high quality physiotherapy support to all athletes during their preparation and competition phase and for the whole duration of the World University Games.
- To establish and build relations with the Organising Committee and physiotherapy structures, and work with the GB Students CMO to cascade all relevant information to HQ and National Governing Body medical staff.
- To participate within regular meetings (in-person or via Teams) as a member of the GB Students Senior Leadership Team offering constructive opinion and support for the overall delivery of medical and performances services across the GB Students Torino 2025 footprint.



- To work closely as part of the GB Students SLT, BUCS International Performance Manager in the detailed planning for the 18 months in advance of the Summer World University Games.
- To work with the Chef de Mission, Chief Medical Officer, BUCS International Performance Manager to recruit a diverse team of HQ Physiotherapists to be deployed during the World University Games.
- To act as the lead and primary contact for all HQ and National Governing Body physiotherapy staff
- To input on and act in accordance with Incident Management Reporting.
- To collate, refine and stock check all necessary medical and physiotherapy consumables and equipment required by the HQ clinical team at The Games with the GB Students CMO; assisting in the ordering, packing, freighting of all items before, during and after The Games in coordination with the BUCS International Performance Manager.
- To provide a responsive, accessible physiotherapy support service to all GB Students delegates, both in a clinic village setting, as an escort during travel, in competition and training venues, on-call and across all other locations deemed appropriate to meet the requirements of the role.
- To ensure a high standard of health promotion and preventative care for athletes and athlete support personnel including Medical Officers, Physiotherapist, Team Leaders, Coaching Staff and others.
- To liaise with other medical personnel and performance services support staff to ensure the
 highest standards of care of an athlete's injury or illness and optimum rehabilitation and
 management extending post-Games, whilst always working within the CSP guidelines on patient
 confidentiality.
- To promote drug-free sport and have a working knowledge of UKAD best practice and The Code (WADA)
- To contribute to pre-event educational resources and materials designed to support delegates.
- To keep detailed, confidential and secure physiotherapy records of all consultations.
- To act and meet requirements in accordance with the official FISU regulations.
- To provide accurate reports on physiotherapy activity within the village or other locations as required.
- To participate in pre-event planning of equipment and supplies in conjunction with the Chief Medical Officer.
- To liaise as required with local medical and emergency staff.
- To maintain such information on treatment as required to provide accurate reports and records.
- To liaise with the Chief Medical Officer on a regular basis regarding duties and to feedback any issues that arise.

The successful candidate will play an active role in the pre-Games planning and organisation of the GB Students Delegation

HOURS OF WORK

Working hours will be as required to fulfil the role and the significant fluctuating demands throughout the World University Games. The post-holder will be required to acknowledge this and work in a flexible manner to accommodate all requests where appropriate.

- Currently working with, or have worked with elite sport athletes for at least 5-10 years.
