Clubs, teams and individuals participating in certain competitions need to affiliate with their National Governing Body (NGB) or meet other requirements to be eligible to take part. Each sport is different. Find out your sport's requirements below.

Please read the details associated with each one for further information. Deadlines will **ONLY** be listed here, not on the sport specific pages or in the rules and regulations.
