4. Competition Format -

Structure of Premier leagues / Tier 1

DM – Proposal put forward to BUCS Competitions group to form a National League. Reasons included following structure of other sports, focusing the best teams in a smaller league and improving competitive balance of leagues.

Proposal rejected by BUCS and institutions – reasons included cost, travel and player welfare.

12. Competition Format - Proposal for Change - Basketball Structure

NK Introducing: This paper is proposing the introduction of a six team Premier (National) League to sit above the current Premier (North/South) leagues – Men's and Women's for the 2025-26 season.

FK: Need to go back to understand how many of these institutions are totally against the implementation of a national league, as opposed to how many were against the proposed format and implementation.

DK: Player travel and player welfare doesn't seem to have been considered for this paper and the feeling is that for those institutions affected it might not fit the student experience we would require for a national league. Looking at our governing body support for other national leagues, especially with the demands that this paper is going to introduce, there isn't enough historical buy in or proposed buy-in from the governing body within the paper for this paper to be

Concerns from the institutions that there's not any consideration for the effects on lower league development.

<u>Outcome: NCG Recommends Revision and Resubmission. Complete review of all</u> feedback given, and all points need to be addressed.

What next?

Competitive imbalance still exists in Women's Prem, less so in Men's Prem. Prem teams surveyed in 2021(?).

MF - competitive imbalance has existed for many years.

RF - look at scores in tier 1.



NK – some prem tier programmes do run smaller leagues (table tennis). Softball programme teams meet four times (inside and outdoor), but very different model,

Hockey prem - eight teams, play each other once only.

IM – Wrote the paper, wanted to increase standards and create an attractive offer. Protect the standard of competition and increase the profile of the sport.

SM – Introduce some player restrictions to reduce imbalance. Speak to BCB, which is targeting British players. Look at developing a partnership with BCB / SLB teams.

NK – No ring-fencing in BUCS comps, always based on performance. This has not been challenged. Look at Super rugby model? The group should look to introduce minimum operating standard within the current Prem structure rather than waiting to re-apply for a National League

JM – wants this discussion to continue, even without introducing a National League. We should focus on what BUCS needs rather than consider the impact on other leagues that teams might play in.

KC - Is BUCS a standalone league or in partnership with other leagues (SLB / BCB)?

NK – Can review and resubmit paper. Concern from members – need to sort issues before implementing national league, not afterwards e.g. fixtures, relationship with NGBs, leagues, etc. NK will share details of decision-making process.

IM – Approach was identifying support, not the first time a national league has been proposed

NK – need an implementation stage after getting approval for the idea. Land the message better with Members. Need to spend this season speaking the clubs, make proposal next season for introduction in the following season.

Will share documents (see attachments in email)

DM – speak to NK / HU about surveying all prem institutions

NK – looking at findings of survey. Men's basketball is big enough to introduce more regionalisation at Tier 2/3. BUCS wants to start conversation with institutions. Proposal paper for Meeting 3 of Competitions group, change for 26/27 season.

Set-up a project group to look at this (Football does this). **Minutes to ask for volunteers**.

Include link of current structures of all sports.

KB – season is very short, hardly any fixtures after Christmas. Trials are only one week before first game

KC - Season starts too close to start of term

NK – Fixtures are linked to Big Wednesday date and works backwards from there – four knockout rounds from 04/02/26 to 25/03/26 for Big Wednesday. Need to provide gaps between playoff rounds to allow institutions to arrange national travel (appendix 2a)

Proposed fixtures dates sent to SAGs in Q3 for following season

Lower tiers play 5 before Xmas and 5 afterwards

Big Wednesday pushed back one week this year (BUCS have looked at historical dates), Easter is a big factor. Tender to host Big Wednesday is a three year contract and dates are set in advance as part of this process.
