

# **BUCS GENERAL REGULATIONS – SIGNIFICANT CHANGES FOR 2025-26 (VERSION 3)**

## PUBLISHED | 26 SEPTEMBER 2025

#### **SUMMARY**

This document highlights some of the changes to BUCS' General Regulations for the 2025-26 season that institutions/Playing Entities should be aware of.

It is not a record of all changes, as it does not contain details of any minor editorial changes, such as wording changes which do not affect the purpose of the regulations, or changes to numbering where regulations have been reordered.

Updated versions of this document will be published should there be further updates to regulations following its initial publication.

Additions for Version 2 were REG 5, REG 15.8.1, REG 15.8.4, REG 15.8.5 and REG 15.8.7.

Amendments for Version 3 are corrections to typos in REG 10.6 of incorrect references to other regulation numbers.

As per the Articles of Association, the BUCS Board may choose to delegate decision-making and responsibility to the BUCS Executive. ### **REG 2.6.2 Main Campus Model**

REG 2.6.2.1 Eligible to be and is a Full BUCS Member (Meets the requirements of the BUCS Articles of Association and REG 2.1) and required to pay annual affiliation fee for institution, including any satellite campus (REG 3.1.1).

REG 2.6.2.2 All teams named as appropriate, one entity within BUCS competitions. Teams to be ranked sequentially. For example:

- UWTSD: Swansea Men's Football 1st
- UWTSD: Swansea Men's Football 2nd
- UWTSD: Swansea Men's Football 3rd

REG 2.6.2.3 Some Ring Fencing of teams granted pending approval of application made alongside team entries each year. (See REG 2.6.7).

**REG 2.6.2.4** All teams administered via a single BUCS Play entity, separate to that of any 'Satellite Campus'.

**REG 2.6.2.5** BUCS Points attributed to single entity, 'Main Campus' only.

**REG 2.6.2.6** Restrictions on allowance of teams per tier, per gender, of a particular sport are applicable as per REG 8.3.1 to single entity. (Separate to that of any 'Satellite Campus').

REG 2.6.2.7 Standard application of individual eligibility criteria (REG 4). Students defined as being within the auspices of this playing entity are only eligible to participate for this entity within BUCS competitions and may not compete for any 'Satellite Campus'.

### **REG 2.6.3 Satellite Campus Model**

REG 2.6.3.1 Not eligible to be a BUCS Member, falls under the membership of 'Main Campus', but required to pay playing entity fee (REG 3.1.1.1)
REG 2.6.3.2 All teams named as appropriate, one entity within BUCS competitions. Teams to be ranked sequentially. For example:

- UWTSD: Carmarthen Men's Football 1st
- UWTSD: Carmarthen Men's Football 2nd

**REG 2.6.1.7** Standard application of individual eligibility criteria (REG 4).

### **REG 2.6.2 Main Campus Model**

**REG 2.6.2.1** Eligible to be and is an Education Institution Member and required to pay the Annual Subscription Fee for the institution, including any satellite campus (REG 3.1.1).

**REG 2.6.2.2** All teams named as appropriate, one entity within BUCS competitions. Teams to be ranked sequentially. For example:

- UWTSD: Swansea Men's Football 1st
- UWTSD: Swansea Men's Football 2nd
- UWTSD: Swansea Men's Football 3rd

REG 2.6.2.3 Some Ring Fencing of teams granted pending approval of application made alongside team entries each year. (See REG 2.6.7).

**REG 2.6.2.4** All teams administered via a single BUCS Play entity, separate to that of any 'Satellite Campus'.

**REG 2.6.2.5** BUCS Points attributed to single entity, 'Main Campus' only.

**REG 2.6.2.6** Restrictions on allowance of teams per tier, per gender, of a particular sport are applicable as per REG 8.3.1 to single entity. (Separate to that of any 'Satellite Campus').

REG 2.6.2.7 Standard application of individual eligibility criteria (REG 4). Students defined as being within the auspices of this Playing Entity are only eligible to participate for this entity within BUCS competitions and may not compete for any 'Satellite Campus'.

## **REG 2.6.3 Satellite Campus Model**

**REG 2.6.3.1** Not eligible to be an Education

Institution Member, falls under the membership of 'Main Campus', but required to pay Playing Entity fee (REG 3.1.1.1).

**REG 2.6.3.2** All teams named as appropriate, one entity within BUCS competitions. Teams to be

 REG 2.6.3.3 Some Ring Fencing of teams granted pending approval of application made alongside team entries each year. (See REG 2.6.7).

**REG 2.6.3.4** All teams administered via a single BUCS Play entity, separate to that of the 'Main Campus'.

**REG 2.6.3.5** BUCS Points attributed to single entity, 'Satellite Campus' only, and cannot be combined with 'Main Campus' or other 'Satellite Campus'.

REG 2.6.3.6 Restrictions on allowance of teams per tier, per gender, of a particular sport are applicable as per REG 8.3.1 to single entity. (Separate to that of 'Main Campus' or any other 'Satellite Campus').

REG 2.6.3.7 Standard application of individual eligibility criteria (REG 4). Students defined as being within the auspices of this playing entity are only eligible to participate for this entity within BUCS competitions and may not compete for 'Main Campus' or any other 'Satellite Campus'.

REG 2.6.4 Umbrella Campus/Organisation Model REG 2.6.4.1 May or may not be eligible to be a Full BUCS Member; dependant on legal entity status under Company law and that meets the requirements of the BUCS Articles of Association and REG 2.1.

**REG 2.6.4.1.1** If eligible to be Full BUCS Member must become one; therefore, the enforcement of students only playing for the Member they are associated with is possible, foregoing the right of 'parent' institution(s) to access students.

REG 2.6.4.1.2 If not eligible to become a Full BUCS Member, must be unanimously declared by contributing BUCS Member institutions as a standalone playing entity, foregoing the right of 'parent' institutions to access students and essentially becomes deemed as a 'satellite campus' but with multiple contributing 'parent' institutions. REG 2.6.4.1.2.1 If not unanimous. BUCS will

ranked sequentially. For example:

- UWTSD: Carmarthen Men's Football 1st
- UWTSD: Carmarthen Men's Football 2nd
- UWTSD: Carmarthen Men's Football 3rd

REG 2.6.3.3 Some Ring Fencing of teams granted pending approval of application made alongside team entries each year. (See REG 2.6.7).

**REG 2.6.3.4** All teams administered via a single BUCS Play entity, separate to that of the 'Main Campus'.

**REG 2.6.3.5** BUCS Points attributed to single entity, 'Satellite Campus' only, and cannot be combined with 'Main Campus' or other 'Satellite Campus'.

**REG 2.6.3.6** Restrictions on allowance of teams per tier, per gender, of a particular sport are applicable as per REG 8.3.1 to single entity. (Separate to that of 'Main Campus' or any other 'Satellite Campus').

REG 2.6.3.7 Standard application of individual eligibility criteria (REG 4). Students defined as being within the auspices of this Playing Entity are only eligible to participate for this entity within BUCS competitions and may not compete for 'Main Campus' or any other 'Satellite Campus'.

REG 2.6.4 Umbrella Campus/Organisation Model REG 2.6.4.1 May or may not be eligible to be an Education Institution Member; dependant on legal entity status under Company law and that meets the requirements of REG 2.1 and the eligibility criteria determined by the Board.

REG 2.6.4.1.1 If eligible to be an Education
Institution Member must become one; therefore, the enforcement of students only playing for the Education Institution Member they are associated with is possible, foregoing the right of 'parent' institution(s) to access students.

REG 2.6.4.1.2 If not eligible to become an Education Institution Member, must be unanimously declared by contributing Education Institution Members as a standalone Playing Entity, foregoing the right of 'parent' institutions to access students and



consider each application on a case by case basis. REG 2.6.4.1.2.2 Institutions must be able to demonstrate that they have a defined way of identifying eligible students should the component institutions not be in agreement.

**REG 2.6.4.2** All teams named as appropriate, one entity within BUCS competitions. Teams to be ranked sequentially. For example:

- Medway Men's Football 1st
- Medway Men's Football 2nd
- Medway Men's Football 3rd

REG 2.6.4.3 Some Ring Fencing of teams granted pending approval of application made alongside team entries each year. (See REG 2.6.7).

**REG 2.6.4.4** All teams administered via a single BUCS Play entity, separate to that of any 'parent' institution(s).

**REG 2.6.4.5** BUCS Points attributed to single entity, 'Umbrella Campus/Organisation' only, and cannot be combined with, or divided amongst, any 'parent' institution(s).

**REG 2.6.4.6** Restrictions on allowance of teams per tier, per gender, of a particular sport are applicable as per REG 8.3.1 to single entity. (Separate to that of any 'parent' institution(s)).

REG 2.6.4.7 Standard application of individual eligibility criteria (REG 4). Students defined as being within the auspices of this playing entity are only eligible to participate for this entity within BUCS competitions and may not compete for any 'parent' institution(s).

# REG 2.6.5 FE College Offering HE Qualifications Model

**REG 2.6.5.1** Eligible to be and must be a Full BUCS Member; otherwise may instead be listed as either 'Satellite Campus' of a 'Main Campus' or covered as part of an 'All Eligible Students' model.

**REG 2.6.5.1.1** If HE students are awarded qualification from another current BUCS Member, said another BUCS Member will relinquish ability

**REG 2.6.4.1.2.1** If not unanimous, BUCS will consider each application on a case-by-case basis.

REG 2.6.4.1.2.2 Institutions must be able to demonstrate that they have a defined way of identifying eligible students should the component institutions not be in agreement.

**REG 2.6.4.2** All teams named as appropriate, one entity within BUCS competitions. Teams to be ranked sequentially. For example:

- Medway Men's Football 1st
- Medway Men's Football 2nd
- Medway Men's Football 3rd

**REG 2.6.4.3** Some Ring Fencing of teams granted pending approval of application made alongside team entries each year. (See REG 2.6.7).

**REG 2.6.4.4** All teams administered via a single BUCS Play entity, separate to that of any 'parent' institution(s).

**REG 2.6.4.5** BUCS Points attributed to single entity, 'Umbrella Campus/Organisation' only, and cannot be combined with, or divided amongst, any 'parent' institution(s).

**REG 2.6.4.6** Restrictions on allowance of teams per tier, per gender, of a particular sport are applicable as per REG 8.3.1 to single entity. (Separate to that of any 'parent' institution(s)).

REG 2.6.4.7 Standard application of individual eligibility criteria (REG 4). Students defined as being within the auspices of this Playing Entity are only eligible to participate for this entity within BUCS competitions and may not compete for any 'parent' institution(s).

# REG 2.6.5 FE College Offering HE Qualifications Model

**REG 2.6.5.1** Eligible to be and must be an Education Institution Member; otherwise may instead be listed as either 'Satellite Campus' of a 'Main Campus' or covered as part of an 'All Eligible Students' model.



for those students to compete for them; as per BUCS regulations an individual may only represent one institution/Playing Entity per season. Should an FE College fulfil the criteria and is successful in becoming a Full BUCS Member then any HE students studying at that College will only be able to compete for that College/Member; not for the institution that awards their qualification.

**REG 2.6.6** Requests for changes to an institution's Playing Entity/Playing Entities must be submitted to the BUCS Executive prior to team entries being opened for the following season.

REG 2.6.7 Ring Fencing Each Playing Entity can also apply for Ring Fencing within their teams. Ring Fencing of teams allows for a variation to the standard BUCS Team Selection regulations (REG 11.1) within the BUCS Team Championships (Leagues/Knockouts) by allowing a Playing Entity to identify separate groupings of student-athletes such as 'Medics'. A Playing Entity wishing to have Ring Fenced teams must complete the BUCS Ring Fenced Teams Pro Forma (Appendix 3) and submit it to the BUCS Executive prior to team entries being closed for the following season.

REG 2.6.5.1.1 If HE students are awarded qualification from another current Education Institution Member, said other Education Institution Member will relinquish ability for those students to compete for them; as per BUCS regulations an individual may only represent one institution/Playing Entity per season. Should an FE College fulfil the criteria and is successful in becoming an Education Institution Member then any HE students studying at that College will only be able to compete for that College/Education Institution Member; not for the institution that awards their qualification.

**REG 2.6.6** Requests for changes to an Education Institution Member's Playing Entity/Playing Entities must be submitted to the BUCS Executive prior to team entries being opened for the following season.

### **REG 2.6.7 Ring Fencing**

**REG 2.6.7.1** Each Playing Entity can also apply for Ring Fencing within their teams. Ring Fencing of teams allows for a variation to the standard BUCS Team Selection regulations (REG 11.1/SQU 7/TAB 7/TEN 9) within the BUCS Team Championships (Leagues/Knockouts) by allowing a Playing Entity to identify separate groupings of student-athletes such as 'Medics' and as a result have separate groupings to which the team selection regulations shall apply Ring Fenced teams will be denoted by their specific group being named in brackets as part of the team's name, for example Cardiff Men's 3 (Medics). **REG 2.6.7.2** To apply to have Ring Fenced teams, a Playing Entity should complete the BUCS Ring Fenced Teams Pro Forma (Appendix 3) and submit it to the BUCS Executive by the Team Entry closing date for approval. REG 5.1 Each BUCS member institution/Playing Entity shall be responsible for ensuring that its student-athletes, officials, employees, representatives and anyone purporting to be its supporters or followers conduct themselves in an orderly fashion whilst attending or taking part in any BUCS Competition, BUCS Competition Event(s) and BUCS Organised Activity. For the purpose of this regulation, BUCS Organised Activity includes but is not limited to any conferences, events, meetings and residentials organised by BUCS.

**REG 5.1.1** Examples of conduct for which BUCS would deem an institution/Playing Entity in breach of REG 5.1 include, but are not limited to:

- Violent, threatening, abusive, obscene or provocative, conduct or language
- Disregarding requests/instructions of Tournament Directors or appointed officials
- Encroachment on the playing area by spectators or unauthorised persons, save for reasons of safety
- Throwing missiles, bottles or other potentially harmful or dangerous objects at, onto or adjacent to the playing area
- Entering, or attempting to enter the venue of a BUCS competition while in possession of recreational drugs
- Entering, or attempting to enter the venue of a BUCS competition while in possession of a flare, smoke bomb or firework
- Consumption of alcohol or recreational drugs (in addition to substances covered under REG 4.5) by competitors. Competitors at any BUCS event or fixture found to be consuming such substances will be automatically disqualified.

**REG 5.1.2** It shall be a defence to a charge in relation to REG 5.1 if an institution/Playing Entity can show that the conduct in question was solely that of a supporter (or anyone purporting to be its supporter or follower) who is not a current member

**REG 5.1.3** throw missiles or other potentially harmful or dangerous objects at or on to the field of play;

REG 5.1.4 in the case of anyone reasonably believed to be its supporters or followers, or other unauthorised persons, encroach on to the field of play or commit any form of field of play incursion, save for reasons of safety;

**REG 5.1.5** disregard the requests/instructions of Tournament Directors or appointed officials;

REG 5.1.6 enter or attempt to enter the venue while in possession of recreational drugs;

**REG 5.1.7** enter or attempt to enter the venue while in possession of a flare, smoke bomb or firework:

**REG 5.1.8** in the case of student-athletes, consume alcohol or recreational drugs (in addition to substances covered under REG 4.4).

**REG 5.2** For the purpose of **REG 5.1**, BUCS Organised Activity includes but is not limited to any conferences, events, meetings and residentials organised by BUCS.

**REG 5.3** Each BUCS Member Institution/Playing Entity shall be responsible for ensuring that its student-athletes, officials, employees and all persons

Changes have been made to REG 5 to provide clearer explanations on what BUCS deems misconduct and the circumstances which could result in a charge or misconduct being raised. The process for dealing with alleged misconduct has been split into several documents, with the aim of making the information easier to understand and accessible for all.



(whether a student, employee, representative or other member) of the member institution/Playing Entity and that it had no reasonable means of controlling or advising on the conduct of the supporter or follower.

REG 5.2 Each BUCS member institution/Playing Entity shall be responsible for ensuring that its student-athletes, officials, and all persons purporting to be its representatives do not conduct themselves in a way, or print/have published any material, which brings, or has the potential to bring, BUCS into disrepute, including on social media platforms.

REG 5.3 Failure to adhere to the provisions of REG 5.1 and/or REG 5.2 may render the institution/Playing Entity liable to a charge of misconduct for failing to fulfil its said responsibilities

**REG 5.4** In the case of a member institution/Playing Entity wishing to lodge a complaint against another, charges under REG 5 will be subject to the following process:

**REG 5.4.1** A written submission should be made to discipline@bucs.org.uk. Complaints of such a nature shall be regarded as FORMAL and must therefore be treated by all parties with the appropriate regard. There shall be no timeframe for BUCS receiving a complaint of this nature. However, dependent on the nature of the complaint, a valid reason for any considerable delay must be provided. If the timeframe is deemed unjustified, the complaint may be dismissed. **REG 5.4.2** BUCS will acknowledge receipt of said complaint in writing by way of e-mail reply within five working days of the complaint being received. **REG 5.4.3** Following acknowledgement of receipt of the complaint, BUCS may seek clarification of details and/or collection of supporting evidence. **REG 5.4.4** BUCS will complete a standardised form summarising the complaint which will be

REG 5.4 It shall be a defence to a charge in relation to REG 5.1 and/or REG 5.3 if an institution/Playing Entity can show that all events, incidents or occurrences complained of were the result of circumstances over which it had no control and that reasonable steps had been taken to prevent such events, incidents or occurrences. However, when considering whether this defence is made out a Pane will consider the following:

- the steps the BUCS Member Institution/Playing Entity had taken prior to the events, incidences or occurrences complained of to prevent such behaviour;
- the steps the BUCS Member Institution/Playing Entity took at the time of the events, incidences or occurrences complained of;
   the severity of the misconduct;
- any previous breaches of REG 5.1 and/or REG 5.3 that have occurred and what subsequent actions were taken by the BUCS Member Institution/Playing Entity.

REG 5.5 Failure to adhere to the provisions of REG 5.1 and/or REG 5.3 may render the institution/Playing Entity liable to a charge of misconduct for failing to fulfil its said responsibilities.

**REG 5.6** Competitors at any BUCS event or fixture found to be consuming alcohol or recreational drugs may be prohibited from participating by the official(s) present.

REG 5.7 To lodge a Misconduct Complaint against a BUCS Member institution/Playing Entity, individuals must follow the process outlined in the BUCS Misconduct Complaints Policy and Procedure (Appendix 20). All Misconduct Complaints will be managed in line with the process outlined in the



forwarded to the accused institution/Playing Entity, along with any supporting evidence. **REG 5.4.5** The accused institution/Playing Entity shall have five working days from receipt of the complaint to respond to the allegation.

REG 5.4.5.1 An extension to the response deadline may be requested to <a href="mailto:discipline@bucs.org.uk">discipline@bucs.org.uk</a> (before the deadline has passed) if there are reasonable grounds, such as completing an internal investigation into the complaint.

REG 5.4.5.2 If the accused institution/Playing Entity fails to respond within the stated timeframe of REG 5.4.5, or any extension to this granted under REG 5.4.5.1, they shall lose the right to appeal (REG 5.4.9) the decision reached and/or sanctions applied by the Disciplinary Panel.

REG 5.4.6 A Disciplinary Panel shall be convened

REG 5.4.6 A Disciplinary Panel shall be convened by the BUCS Executive to hear the charge. The Panel shall be comprised of:

- BUCS Chair of Disciplinary
- Two students or sabbatical officers of BUCS member institutions, subject to them not being from the same playing conference as either institution/Playing Entity involved in the dispute REG 5.4.7 The Disciplinary Panel will convene in a timeframe appropriate to the complaint, with consideration for the ability of all parties to provide representation at the hearing and taking into consideration potential impact on future participation in BUCS competitions.

REG 5.4.7.1 Where the complaint relates to an Individual and Team Championships (Events) sport, an institution/Playing Entity may be prevented from entering further events in the same sport where a charge has been brought and the matter has not been concluded.

**REG 5.4.8** The decision(s) reached, and any sanctions applied by the Disciplinary Panel, shall be communicated verbally immediately following the conclusion of the hearing and subsequently

BUCS Misconduct Complaints Policy and Procedure (Appendix 20).

REG 5.8 Where it is deemed that there is a case to be answered following a complaint investigation and a subsequent charge of misconduct is raised, BUCS shall convene a Disciplinary Panel to hear the case.

This shall be conducted in line with BUCS Misconduct Disciplinary Policy and Procedure (Appendix 21).

It is worth noting that institutions/Playing Entities persistently failing to provide the appropriate match officials for reasons deemed to be within their control could have teams withdrawn or restricted from entering future competitions under REG 8.2.

However, should it not be possible for this process to be completed on BUCS Play prior to the match starting, for example there is no Wi-Fi or mobile phone reception at the venue, then the teams should follow the process of REG 11.2.10. All teams are advised to carry with them at least two hard copies of the BUCS Team Sheet Pro Forma (Appendix 7) so that they are adequately prepared for any such scenario.

REG 11.2.3 The overriding principle should always be to complete fixtures. If issues are identified that a team may wish to appeal against (REG 15), they should 'dispute' their opposition's team sheet as detailed in these regulations and complete a Playing Under Protest Form as outlined in REG 12. REG 11.2.4 Each team is responsible for ensuring

### **REG 11.2 Team sheets**

**REG 11.2.1** For all fixtures, teams are required to complete and have their opposition verify a team sheet prior to the match starting.

**REG 11.2.2** Team sheets should be completed and verified on BUCS Play. However, should it not be possible for this process to be completed on BUCS Play prior to the match starting, for example there is no Wi-Fi or mobile phone reception at the venue. then paper team sheets can be used. Where paper team sheets are used there must be in some form a minimum of two copies of the team sheet, one for the home team to retain and one for the away team to retain (note REG 11.2.8). Each team is responsible for the correct completion and retention of their own copy. All teams are advised to carry with them at least two hard copies of the BUCS Team Sheet Pro Forma (Appendix 7) so that they are adequately prepared for any such scenario. If a team does not have a BUCS Team Sheet Pro Forma with them, any equivalent paperwork used/produced must capture the following essential information

The previously separate regulations covering completion and verification of teams sheets on BUCS Play and those covering the use of paper team sheets have been merged and streamlined to make the regulations easier to follow.

REG 11.2.8 It is advised, to avoid the need for verification post-fixture, that teams should take to all fixtures a list of individuals, including copies of individual photographic identification, that has been verified by their Athletic Union (or

provided.

REG 11.2.6 If either captain finds that any individuals on the opposition team are unable to provide identification, or otherwise has any concerns over their eligibility, they should complete a Playing Under Protest Form (REG 12) detailing any grievances and if using BUCS Play 'dispute' the team sheet as per REG 11.2.7. Where individuals are unable to provide identification, time and date stamped photographs should be taken on the day of any individual(s) in question. Any individual refusing to have their photograph taken should be noted on the Playing Under Protest Form. Verification should then be sought post-fixture with the appropriate Athletic Union (or equivalent) representative(s).

REG 16.1.6 BUCS shall have the exclusive right to exploit the BUCS Commercial Rights itself and/or licence the exploitation of the BUCS Commercial Rights to any third party subject to these Regulations.

REG 16.1.7 When using or licensing the use of Participant Imagery, Member Logos and/or Member Content for commercial purposes BUCS shall ensure that it observes the provisions of these Regulations and shall ensure that the use of such assets does not damage the reputation and good standing of the Participant and/or Member is question, including by association with any product and/or service categories that involve activities contrary to the policies and principles of BUCS (including but not limited to the BUCS Ethical Partner Investment Policy) and student sport in general.

REG 16.2 Content Assets

REG 16.2.1 All Content Rights in and to BUCS Events are the exclusive property of BUCS.

REG 16.2.2 All Content Rights in and to Member Events are the exclusive property of BUCS and BUCS authorises each Member to commercialise such Member Content Rights in accordance with and subject to the provisions of these Regulations.

REG 16.2.3 All Content Rights in and to Member Internal Events are the exclusive property of the Member.

REG 16.2.4 BUCS shall have no right to any Content in National Events.

both clarity, and to allow for the differentials in types of rights (i.e. Commercial and Content) and how these can and cannot be exploited by both BUCS Members and the BUCS organisation to be recognised.

The changes intend to provide clarity for all parties on the opportunities available and seek to navigate a balance in such opportunities for BUCS Members of any size, focus and scope, and for the BUCS organisation as a non-profit membership organisation to achieve central benefits impacting on all Members.



Member Events shall be the property of BUCS and the Member hereby assigns such rights to BUCS by way of future copyright. BUCS shall be entitled to licence such Content, and the right to broadcast such Content. (including to broadcasters), as part of the BUCS Commercial Programme and each Member shall observe and comply with any and all exclusivity and other relevant conditions arising from such licence as BUCS may notify to the Member from time to time. Members shall be entitled to broadcast Content captured at BUCS Competition Member via the Member's own platforms with the prior written consent of BUCS and subject to any conditions relating to such broadcast as BUCS may notify to the Member. but the Member shall have no right to licence such Content to any third party broadcaster.

### **REG 1.6.5 Definitions**

- (i) **BUCS Commercial Partner:** any third party to which BUCS has granted any Commercial Rights; (ii) **BUCS Commercial Programme:** the central BUCS commercial programme comprising all Commercial Rights in BUCS and BUCS Competitions:
- (iii) BUCS Competition: any sports competition organised by BUCS from time to time; (iv) **BUCS Competition Event(s)**: any BUCS Competition final fixture, playoff or other sports meet wholly staged and organised by BUCS or a third party arranged by BUCS;
- (v) **BUCS Competition Member Event:** any sports fixture forming part of a BUCS Competition organised by or on behalf of any Member at a venue owned or occupied by a Member; (vi) **BUCS Logo:** the names, logos, crests, colours,
- slogans, symbols, or any other identifying marks used or adopted by BUCS from time to time; (vii) Commercial Rights: any and all rights of a commercial nature, including image rights, broadcasting rights, broadcast sponsorship rights, new media rights, endorsement and official

REG 16.2.5 BUCS shall have the exclusive right to exploit the BUCS Content Rights itself and/or licence the exploitation of the BUCS Content Rights to any third party subject to these Regulations **REG 16.2.6** BUCS shall procure that any BUCS Content Partner is a reputable business in accordance with the BUCS Ethical Partner Investment Policy and meets BUCS's and Members delivery requirements including those relating to IT security.

**REG 16.2.7** Without prejudice to each Member's rights under REG 16.2.8. BUCS shall, when negotiating any agreement with a BUCS Content Partner which includes Member Content, procure the following rights for Members in respect of a Member Event in which the Member participates: a) The right to show live coverage of via the

- Member's own broadcast platform where the BUCS Content Partner has declined the opportunity to show live coverage of such Member Event via its own platform. BUCS shall notify the Member in guestion forthwith upon the BUCS Content Partner declining such opportunity;
- b) The right to show delayed coverage and/or highlights packages via the Member's own broadcast platform;
- c) The right to use clips in the Member's own marketing activity and to licence the use of such clips to Member Commercial Partners.

**REG 16.2.8** Each Member may commercialise the Member Content Rights in the Member Events it organises, on an exclusive basis PROVIDED **ALWAYS THAT:** 

a) each Member grants to BUCS the right, free of charge and in perpetuity, to use Member Content (in the form of clips, highlights and Archive Member Content) for its own commercial and broadcasting purposes and to licence the use of such Member Content to BUCS Commercial Partners and BUCS Content Partners for their commercial and



supplier rights, sponsorship rights, merchandising rights, licensing rights, advertising rights and hospitality rights;

> (viii) Content: all and any videographic, photographic and typographic content;

(ix) Member Content: any and all Content captured of, and relating to, the Member Teams and/or Participants at any and all BUCS Competition Member Events:

(x) Member Assets: the Member Logos, the Member Branding and the Member Content; (xi) Member Branding: up to fifty per cent (50%) of the in-camera signage and other branding at BUCS Competition Member Events as requested by BUCS from time to time;

(xii) Member Logo: the names, logos, crests, colours, slogans, symbols, or any other identifying marks used or adopted by the Member and any Member Team:

(xiii) Member Team: any team representing the Member in any BUCS Competition; (xiv) Participant: any individual representing a Member Team and/or the Member in any BUCS Competition.
