

BUCS GENERAL REGULATIONS - SIGNIFICANT CHANGES FOR 2025-26 (VERSION 1)

PUBLISHED | 12 SEPTEMBER 2025

SUMMARY

This document highlights some of the changes to BUCS' General Regulations for the 2025-26 season that institutions/Playing Entities should be aware of.

It is not a record of all changes, as it does not contain details of any minor editorial changes, such as wording changes which do not affect the purpose of the regulations, or changes to numbering where regulations have been reordered.

Updated versions of this document will be published should there be further updates to regulations following its initial publication.

It was recognised that it was not correct to state that all regulations were "endorsed" by the Board, as they were not being asked by the BUCS Executive to specifically endorse each and every amendment to them. To require the board to review and endorse all amendments would not be practical and there are important and significant differences between those BUCS regulations that might be considered more corporate regulations and those which are more competition, or sport, specific. As per the Articles of Association, the BUCS Board may choose to delegate decision-making and responsibility to the BUCS Executive. The Board may also revoke delegation in whole, or in part, at any time following majority agreement of the Board. There is now a Board approved Regulation Scheme of Delegation in place to clarify where authority has been delegated to the BUCS Executive for the setting and amending of BUCS's General and Sport Specific Regulations and where it has not. As well as clarifying the responsibility of the Executive in terms of what can be amended, and how, the new regulations provide more clarity on the role and

- All Eligible Students of a BUCS Member playing as one entity regardless of geographical spread/campuses, etc.
- Main Campus of a BUCS Member playing as one entity. (Similar to 'All Eligible Students')
- Satellite Campus of a BUCS Member playing as a separate entity from the 'Main Campus' and/or other campuses of the same institution.
- Umbrella Campus/Organisation which is comprised of students from multiple institutions.
- Further Education (FE) College offering Higher Education (HE) qualifications provided by another external awarding body.

REG 2.6.1.2 All teams named as appropriate, one entity within BUCS competitions regardless of number of campuses and geographical spread. Teams to be ranked sequentially regardless of origin. For example:

- Brighton Women's Hockey 1st
- Brighton Women's Hockey 2nd
- Brighton Women's Hockey 3rd

REG 2.6.1.3 Some Ring Fencing of teams granted pending approval of application made alongside team entries each year. (See REG 2.6.7). For example:

- Brighton Women's Hockey 1st (Eastbourne)

REG 2.6.1.5 BUCS Points attributed to single entity.

REG 2.6.1.5 BUCS Points attributed to single entity. **REG 2.6.1.6** Restrictions on allowance of teams per

reflect the fact that late entries can be accepted, at the discretion of the BUCS Executive, given that they do not have any bearing on the building of provisional leagues or the creation of fixtures and ultimately Ring Fencing just needs to be in place before fixtures start. Generally updated to improve readability and provide more context.

REG 2.6.2 Main Campus Model

REG 2.6.2.1 Eligible to be and is a Full BUCS Member (Meets the requirements of the BUCS Articles of Association and REG 2.1) and required to pay annual affiliation fee for institution, including any satellite campus (REG 3.1.1).

REG 2.6.2.2 All teams named as appropriate, one entity within BUCS competitions. Teams to be ranked sequentially. For example:

- UWTSD: Swansea Men's Football 1st
- UWTSD: Swansea Men's Football 2nd
- UWTSD: Swansea Men's Football 3rd

REG 2.6.2.3 Some Ring Fencing of teams granted pending approval of application made alongside team entries each year. (See REG 2.6.7).

REG 2.6.2.4 All teams administered via a single BUCS Play entity, separate to that of any 'Satellite Campus'.

REG 2.6.2.5 BUCS Points attributed to single entity, 'Main Campus' only.

REG 2.6.2.6 Restrictions on allowance of teams per tier, per gender, of a particular sport are applicable as per REG 8.3.1 to single entity. (Separate to that of any 'Satellite Campus'). REG 2.6.2.7 Standard application of individual eligibility criteria (REG 4). Students defined as being within the auspices of this playing entity are only eligible to participate for this entity within

'Satellite Campus'. REG 2.6.3 Satellite Campus Model

REG 2.6.2 Main Campus Model

REG 2.6.2.1 Eligible to be and is an Education Institution Member and required to pay the Annual Subscription Fee for the institution, including any satellite campus (REG 3.1.1).

REG 2.6.2.2 All teams named as appropriate, one entity within BUCS competitions. Teams to be ranked sequentially. For example:

- UWTSD: Swansea Men's Football 1st
- UWTSD: Swansea Men's Football 2nd
- UWTSD: Swansea Men's Football 3rd

REG 2.6.2.3 Some Ring Fencing of teams granted pending approval of application made alongside team entries each year. (See REG 2.6.7).

REG 2.6.2.4 All teams administered via a single BUCS Play entity, separate to that of any 'Satellite Campus'.

REG 2.6.2.5 BUCS Points attributed to single entity, 'Main Campus' only.

REG 2.6.2.6 Restrictions on allowance of teams per tier, per gender, of a particular sport are applicable as per REG 8.3.1 to single entity. (Separate to that of any 'Satellite Campus').

REG 2.6.2.7 Standard application of individual eligibility criteria (REG 4). Students defined as being within the auspices of this Playing Entity are only eligible to participate for this entity within BUCS competitions and may not compete for any 'Satellite Campus'.

REG 2.6.3 Satellite Campus Model

REG 2.6.3.1 Not eligible to be an Education Institution Member, falls under the membership of 'Main Campus', but required to pay Playing Entity fee (REG 3.1.1.1).

REG 2.6.3.2 All teams named as appropriate, one entity within BUCS competitions. Teams to be

- REG 2.6.3.7 Standard application of individual eligibility criteria (REG 4). Students defined as being within the auspices of this playing entity are only eligible to participate for this entity within BUCS competitions and may not compete for 'Main Campus' or any other 'Satellite Campus'. REG 2.6.4 Umbrella Campus/Organisation Model REG 2.6.4.1 May or may not be eligible to be a Full BUCS Member; dependant on legal entity status under Company law and that meets the requirements of the BUCS Articles of Association and REG 2.1.
- REG 2.6.4.1.1 If eligible to be Full BUCS Member must become one; therefore, the enforcement of students only playing for the Member they are associated with is possible, foregoing the right of 'parent' institution(s) to access students.

REG 2.6.4.1.2 If not eligible to become a Full BUCS Member, must be unanimously declared by contributing BUCS Member institutions as a standalone playing entity, foregoing the right of 'parent' institutions to access students and essentially becomes deemed as a 'satellite campus'

REG 2.6.3.3 Some Ring Fencing of teams granted pending approval of application made alongside team entries each year. (See REG 2.6.7).

REG 2.6.3.4 All teams administered via a single BUCS Play entity, separate to that of the 'Main Campus'.

REG 2.6.3.5 BUCS Points attributed to single entity, 'Satellite Campus' only, and cannot be combined with 'Main Campus' or other 'Satellite Campus'.

REG 2.6.3.6 Restrictions on allowance of teams per tier, per gender, of a particular sport are applicable as per REG 8.3.1 to single entity. (Separate to that of 'Main Campus' or any other 'Satellite Campus').

REG 2.6.3.7 Standard application of individual eligibility criteria (REG 4). Students defined as being within the auspices of this Playing Entity are only eligible to participate for this entity within BUCS competitions and may not compete for 'Main Campus' or any other 'Satellite Campus'.

REG 2.6.4 Umbrella Campus/Organisation Model REG 2.6.4.1 May or may not be eligible to be an Education Institution Member; dependant on legal entity status under Company law and that meets the requirements of REG 2.1 and the eligibility criteria determined by the Board.

REG 2.6.4.1.1 If eligible to be an Education Institution Member must become one; therefore, the enforcement of students only playing for the Education Institution Member they are associated with is possible, foregoing the right of 'parent' institution(s) to access students.

REG 2.6.4.1.2 If not eligible to become an Education Institution Member, must be unanimously declared by contributing Education Institution Members as a standalone Playing Entity, foregoing the right of 'parent' institutions to access students and



but with multiple contributing 'parent' institutions. REG 2.6.4.1.2.1 If not unanimous, BUCS will consider each application on a case by case basis. REG 2.6.4.1.2.2 Institutions must be able to demonstrate that they have a defined way of identifying eligible students should the component institutions not be in agreement.

REG 2.6.4.2 All teams named as appropriate, one entity within BUCS competitions. Teams to be ranked sequentially. For example:

- Medway Men's Football 1st
- Medway Men's Football 2nd

REG 2.6.4.3 Some Ring Fencing of teams granted pending approval of application made alongside team entries each year. (See REG 2.6.7).

REG 2.6.4.4 All teams administered via a single BUCS Play entity, separate to that of any 'parent' institution(s).

REG 2.6.4.5 BUCS Points attributed to single entity, 'Umbrella Campus/Organisation' only, and cannot be combined with, or divided amongst, any 'parent' institution(s).

REG 2.6.4.6 Restrictions on allowance of teams per tier, per gender, of a particular sport are applicable as per REG 8.3.1 to single entity. (Separate to that of any 'parent' institution(s)). REG 2.6.4.7 Standard application of individual eligibility criteria (REG 4). Students defined as being within the auspices of this playing entity are only eligible to participate for this entity within BUCS competitions and may not compete for any 'parent' institution(s).

REG 2.6.5 FE College Offering HE Qualifications Model

REG 2.6.5.1 Eligible to be and must be a Full BUCS Member; otherwise may instead be listed as either 'Satellite Campus' of a 'Main Campus' or covered as part of an 'All Eligible Students' model.

REG 2.6.5.1.1 If HE students are awarded

REG 2.6.4.3 Some Ring Fencing of teams granted pending approval of application made alongside team entries each year. (See REG 2.6.7).

REG 2.6.4.4 All teams administered via a single BUCS Play entity, separate to that of any 'parent' institution(s).

REG 2.6.4.5 BUCS Points attributed to single entity, 'Umbrella Campus/Organisation' only, and cannot be combined with, or divided amongst, any 'parent' institution(s).

REG 2.6.4.6 Restrictions on allowance of teams per tier, per gender, of a particular sport are applicable as per REG 8.3.1 to single entity. (Separate to that of any 'parent' institution(s)).

REG 2.6.4.7 Standard application of individual eligibility criteria (REG 4). Students defined as being within the auspices of this Playing Entity are only eligible to participate for this entity within BUCS competitions and may not compete for any 'parent' institution(s).

REG 2.6.5 FE College Offering HE Qualifications Model

REG 2.6.5.1 Eligible to be and must be an Education Institution Member; otherwise may instead be listed as either 'Satellite Campus' of a 'Main Campus' or covered as part of an 'All Eligible Students' model.



qualification from another current BUCS Member, said another BUCS Member will relinquish ability for those students to compete for them; as per BUCS regulations an individual may only represent one institution/Playing Entity per season. Should an FE College fulfil the criteria and is successful in becoming a Full BUCS Member then any HE students studying at that College will only be able to compete for that College/Member; not for the institution that awards their qualification.

REG 2.6.6 Requests for changes to an institution's Playing Entity/Playing Entities must be submitted to the BUCS Executive prior to team entries being opened for the following season.

REG 2.6.7 Ring Fencing Each Playing Entity can also apply for Ring Fencing within their teams. Ring Fencing of teams allows for a variation to the standard BUCS Team Selection regulations (REG 11.1) within the BUCS Team Championships (Leagues/Knockouts) by allowing a Playing Entity to identify separate groupings of student-athletes such as 'Medics'. A Playing Entity wishing to have Ring Fenced teams must complete the BUCS Ring Fenced Teams Pro Forma (Appendix 3) and submit it to the BUCS Executive prior to team entries being closed for the following season.

REG 2.6.5.1.1 If HE students are awarded qualification from another current Education Institution Member, said other Education Institution Member will relinquish ability for those students to compete for them; as per BUCS regulations an individual may only represent one institution/Playing Entity per season. Should an FE College fulfil the criteria and is successful in becoming an Education Institution Member then any HE students studying at that College will only be able to compete for that College/Education Institution Member; not for the institution that awards their qualification.

REG 2.6.6 Requests for changes to an Education Institution Member's Playing Entity/Playing Entities must be submitted to the BUCS Executive prior to team entries being opened for the following season.

REG 2.6.7 Ring Fencing

REG 2.6.7.1 Each Playing Entity can also apply for Ring Fencing within their teams. Ring Fencing of teams allows for a variation to the standard BUCS Team Selection regulations (REG 11.1/SQU 7/TAB 7/TEN 9) within the BUCS Team Championships (Leagues/Knockouts) by allowing a Playing Entity to identify separate groupings of student-athletes such as 'Medics' and as a result have separate groupings to which the team selection regulations shall apply. Ring Fenced teams will be denoted by their specific group being named in brackets as part of the team's name, for example Cardiff Men's 3 (Medics). REG 2.6.7.2 To apply to have Ring Fenced teams, a Playing Entity should complete the BUCS Ring Fenced Teams Pro Forma (Appendix 3) and submit it to the BUCS Executive by the Team Entry closing date for approval. The BUCS Executive may, at their discretion, accept late requests for Ring Fencing. **REG 2.6.7.3** Playing Entities failing to appropriately apply for teams to be designated as Ring Fenced, or having their application rejected, will not be eligible

REG 8.3.4 Withdrawals and refunds Whether an institution/Playing Entity can withdraw a team and how, whether they will be eligible for an entry fee refund, and the impact on that team should they re-enter for the following season, will be subject to the following regulations:

REG 8.3.4.1 Prior to the Team Entry closing date, any entries submitted can be withdrawn through BUCS Play. Entry fees will not be charged for teams withdrawn prior to the deadline.

REG 8.3.4.2 Once the Team Entry closing date has passed, and prior to the closing of the initial Provisional Leagues Feedback Window, any teams submitted can be withdrawn by emailing fixtures@bucs.org.uk. Entry fees will not be charged for teams withdrawn during this window. REG 8.3.4.3 Once the initial Provisional Leagues Feedback Window closing date has passed.

REG 8.3.4.3.1 If BUCS has not been able to accommodate a team in a competition, the institution will not be charged the entry fee.

Rather than being removed from the competition structure and treated as a new team for the following season they will be relegated by one tier, except where there is no such tier below the following season. Whilst the majority of withdrawals currently come from teams in the lowest tier of their structures, there can be cases where a team being withdrawn sits higher up a structure, which they feel is not an appropriate level for them, but a move to the bottom of the whole structure would result in a similar outcome, with them being too strong for teams around them.

- Any programmes where a difference in league size means some leagues being compared have had teams scheduled on a 'home' and 'away' basis and others have had teams just scheduled on a 'home' or 'away' basis, so comparing results against the highest finishing three teams etc. would not be comparing the same number of fixtures.
- Any programmes where there is just a single tier of competition, such as Baseball, and so three team leagues are permitted (REG 8.3.2.2) and in such a case for those leagues there would only be results against a highest finishing two teams to use.

Rather than introduce this as a third method to be used in just these cases, which may cause some confusion as to the applicable method, it is proposed to replace the existing REG 8.4.3.1.2 method.

REG 10.6.1 For all competitions, if at least 48 hours' (outside of weekends and bank holidays) notice ahead of the start time of the fixture has been given and the appropriate written evidence provided, then the away institution/Playing Entity may choose to host the match provided it can supply the appropriate officials and facilities, and notifies the opposition and the BUCS Executive by 11:00 on the last working day before the fixture. In this case the original home institution/Playing Entity is obliged to travel.

REG 10.6.1.1 Where the away institution/Playing Entity chooses not to host and agreement cannot be reached between the institutions/Playing Entities for rescheduling, the match shall be replayed at a venue and on a date determined by the BUCS Executive.

REG 10.6.2 Any institution/Playing Entity failing to notify the opposition of the failure to obtain the appropriate officials at least 48 hours (outside of weekends and bank holidays) before the fixture start time will forfeit the match and concede a walkover.

REG 10.6.3 Non-provision of officials due to being let down by an appointed/booked official within 48 hours of the fixture start time REG 10.6.3.1 If the away team has arrived at the venue and the home team is let down by an appointed/booked official and can prove in writing that the official was appointed/booked, the original home team will be obliged to travel to a rescheduled match.

REG 10.6.3.2 If the away team has not yet travelled, and the home side notifies them that they have been let down by an appointed/booked official within 48 hours of the fixture start time (providing written evidence as per REG 10.6.3.1) the match shall be rescheduled to be played at the original home team venue.

REG 10.7 Should the two institutions/Playing

REG 10.6.3.3 Where, under REG 10.6.3.2, the away team has started travelling to the fixture or arrived at the venue prior to being made aware of the appropriate match officials not being provided, they

reason the impact on the fixture shall be more consistent, but with REG 10.6.2 (formerly REG 10.6.1 and REG 10.6.1.1) still allowing the BUCS Executive to consider why an institution/Playing Entity has failed to provide the appropriate match officials if required to determine a date and venue for a rescheduling, as has been the case for BUCS basketball for four seasons now, or to decide if the match should be awarded as a walkover.

Due to concerns being raised regarding the option under the old REG 10.6.1 for the opposition to host the fixture and only needing to give notice of this by 11:00 on the last working day before the fixture, this element has been removed from the new REG 10.6.2. The inclusion of the new option for the BUCS Executive to award a walkover, would hopefully not be an option needing to be regularly used, but may be appropriate in some cases, for example late in the season where there are limited or no options to reschedule and it is clear that reasonable efforts were not made to appoint/book officials. By removing the automatic option for the opposition to host on the same day, there is the chance that this could lead to more of such fixtures being rescheduled, but it is hoped that this removes the concerns regarding the potential for more walkovers from teams unable to sort transport at short notice - or extremely high costs where transport can be arranged, and still enables institutions to work together to find a solution, with the BUCS Executive in place to assist where this doesn't happen.



Entities concerned agree in writing beforehand to play with non-neutral, not appropriately qualified and/or the incorrect number of officials, the BUCS Executive will accept the result. Neither team can play under protest or appeal against the result of a match played under these circumstances.

may choose to 'play under protest' in accordance with REG 12 if the first named (home) institution/Playing Entity is able to provide match officials who do not meet the requirements. Should they do so, then their institution/Playing Entity shall have the right to appeal the result in accordance with REG 15. If they proceed with the match without playing under protest in accordance with REG 12, then they shall be deemed to have accepted the conditions and can therefore not later 'play under protest' regarding them, nor submit a match appeal (REG 15) based on those grounds. REG 10.6.4 Where REG 10.6.3 is not applicable and the first named (home) institution/Playing Entity has failed to provide the appropriate match officials and has not notified the opposition (away) institution/Playing Entity of a lack of appointed/booked officials at least 48 hours (outside of weekends and bank holidays) before the fixture start time, unless otherwise agreed between the institutions/Playing Entities: REG 10.6.4.1 In the case of a league match: If a breach of REG 10.2 has been reported by the opposition (away) institution/Playing Entity, and confirmed by the BUCS Executive, before the

If, due to the proximity to the following round of the breach being identified, the team awarded the walkover win cannot fulfil the

It is worth noting that institutions/Playing Entities persistently failing to provide the appropriate match officials for reasons deemed to be within their control could have teams withdrawn or restricted from entering future competitions under REG 8.2.

REG 10.6 generally restructured and reworded with aim of making it easier to understand and using terms that connect with other related regulations. As part of this, the new REG 10.6.4 replaces the old REG 10.6.2 providing the ability for breaches of REG 10.2 not communicated appropriately to be dealt with outside of the time constraints of the playing under protest and match appeal regulations, as has been the case with team selection breaches under REG 11.1.2.1 and REG 11.1.2.2 since the start of the 2023-24 season, although in this case only by an institution/Playing Entity involved in the specific fixture. This is because where an institution/Playing Entity has not complied with REG 10.6.2 (formerly REG 10.6.1) the situation would currently be that they may go unpenalised for not meeting the requirements, simply because the breach has not been made aware to the opposition and they themselves have not identified this as a problem before the match appeal deadline has passed. It is not something they would reasonably be expected to be able to identify at the fixture as there is no requirement for match officials across all sports to evidence at the fixture that they meet the requirements this is something the first named (home) institution/Playing Entity should have ensured as part of the appointment/booking



following round fixture, this shall be recorded as an involuntary walkover win to the opposition, unless both teams agree to reschedule the fixture.

REG 10.6.4.3 In the case of 'round robin'/'mini league' format playoff matches, REG 10.6.5.1 shall apply with references to the "league deadline date" replaced with "playoff deadline date". In the case of 'knockout' format playoff matches, REG 10.6.5.2 shall apply, except for any playoff 'final' matches for which REG 10.6.5.1 shall apply with references to the "league deadline date" replaced with "playoff deadline date".

REG 10.6.4.4 An institution/Playing Entity wishing to report a potential breach of REG 10.2 to the BUCS Executive should do so via email to discipline@bucs.org.uk and will be expected to ensure that there is validity to any claims before they make their report. As such, the Match Appeals process (REG 15) does not have to be used to raise such breaches. Reports deemed to be frivolous, vexatious or not containing adequate information to justify why it is considered a breach of REG 10.2 may result in a charge of misconduct being raised in accordance with REG 5.

process. Having the appropriate match officials is important for ensuring fair and safe competition, with concerns regarding matches having taken place without the correct officials in place and without teams being informed and in agreement with this in advance having been raised in recent seasons.

REG 10.7 removed and new wording including throughout REG 10.6 due the old wording of both REG 10.6 and REG 10.7 having caused some confusion regarding whether there was a need to play under protest in the absence of written agreement in order to subsequently be able to submit a match appeal. REG 10.6.3.3 now clear on the only situation where a team may choose to play under protest if they wish to proceed with a fixture where an appointed/booked appropriate match official withdraws from a fixture within 48 hours of the fixture start time - only if the away team has started travelling to the fixture or arrived at the venue prior to being made aware of the appropriate match officials not being provided.

Regulation now refers to a failure to provide the appropriate match officials, rather than obtain them, as in some cases they had been obtained but they subsequently withdrew.

It is important to note that within these regulations there is still the ability for the two institutions/Playing Entities to be able to agree to use match officials that do not meet the requirements.



REG 11.1.2.1

REG 11.1 Team selection

REG 11.1.2.1 Individuals may not be fielded (including as an unused substitute) for multiple teams in the same sport on the same day.

REG 11.1.2.1.1 Where a Playing Entity is found to have fielded an individual for multiple teams in the same sport on the same day, the following shall apply:

- In the case of a league match: If a breach of REG 11.1.2.1 has been identified before the relevant league deadline date as identified in Appendix 2 ('BUCS Leagues and Knockouts Dates and Deadlines') for the fixture for which there was a breach, the fixture shall be conceded as a walkover win to the opposition.
- In the case of a knockout competition match: If a breach of REG 11.1.2.1 has been identified before the following round, the fixture shall be conceded as a walkover win to the opposition. If, due to the proximity to the following round of the breach being identified, the team awarded the walkover win is not able to fulfil the following round fixture, this shall be recorded as an involuntary walkover win to the opposition, unless both teams agree to reschedule the fixture.
- The first fixture an individual is fielded for is not affected as at this point REG 11.1.2.1 has not been breached, only any subsequent fixture(s) shall be affected.
- A Playing Entity wishing to report a breach of REG 11.1.2.1 to the BUCS Executive should do so via email to discipline@bucs.org.uk and will be expected to ensure that there is validity to any claims before they make their report. As such, the Match Appeals process (REG 15) does not have to be used to raise such breaches. Reports deemed to be frivolous or not containing adequate information may result in disciplinary action.

REG 11.1 Team selection

REG 11.1.2.1 Individuals may not be fielded (including as an unused substitute) for multiple teams in the same Championships on the same day.

REG 11.1.2.1.1 Where a Playing Entity is found to have fielded (including as an unused substitute) an individual for multiple teams in the same

Championships on the same day, the following shall apply:

REG 11.1.2.1.1.1 In the case of a league match: If a breach of REG 11.1.2.1 has been identified before the relevant league deadline date as identified in Appendix 2 ('BUCS Leagues and Knockouts – Dates and Deadlines') for the fixture for which there was a breach, the fixture shall be conceded as a walkover win to the opposition.

REG 11.1.2.1.1.2 In the case of a knockout competition match: If a breach of REG 11.1.2.1 has been identified before the following round, the fixture shall be conceded as a walkover win to the opposition. If, due to the proximity to the following round of the breach being identified, the team awarded the walkover win is not able to fulfil the following round fixture, this shall be recorded as an involuntary walkover win to the opposition, unless both teams agree to reschedule the fixture.

If, due to the proximity to the following round of the breach being identified, the team awarded the walkover win is not able to fulfil the following round fixture, this shall be recorded as an involuntary walkover win to the opposition, unless both teams agree to reschedule the fixture.

REG 11.1.2.2.1.3 In the case of 'round robin'/'mini league' format playoff matches, REG 11.1.2.2.1.1 shall apply with references to the "league deadline date" replaced with "playoff deadline date". In the case of 'knockout' format playoff matches, REG 11.1.2.2.1.2 shall apply, except for any playoff 'final' matches for which REG 11.1.2.2.1.1 shall apply with references to the "league deadline date" replaced with "playoff deadline date"

REG 11.1.2.2.1.4 A Playing Entity wishing to report a breach of REG 11.1.2.2 to the BUCS Executive should do so via email to discipline@bucs.org.uk and will be expected to ensure that there is validity to any claims before they make their report. As such, the Match Appeals process (REG 15) does not have to be used to raise such breaches. Reports deemed

to be frivolous, vexatious or not containing adequate information to justify why it is considered a breach of REG 11.1.2.2 may result in a charge of misconduct being raised in accordance with REG 5.



REG 11.1.3

REG 11.1 Team Selection

REG 11.1.3 Where a Playing Entity has more than one fixture scheduled across its teams in a Championships on a given day, priority must be given to the highest ranked team and then in descending order through their teams should the Playing Entity be unable to fulfil all scheduled fixtures. Matches played in contravention of this regulation will be awarded to the opposition, or in certain circumstances, be voided. For example, a Playing Entity may NOT concede a walkover at second team level, while continuing to field a lower ranked team on the same day.

REG 11.1.3.1 For possible exceptions to REG 11.1.3 due to 'Ring Fencing' of teams, refer to REG 11.1.5.

REG 11.1.3.2 Involuntary walkovers may be granted if applied for in accordance with walkover regulations in REG 13 meaning that REG 11.1.3 would be suspended in some instances, for example on health and safety grounds. Application to suspend REG 11.1.3 must be made to the BUCS Executive in advance of affected fixtures.

REG 11.1 Team Selection

REG 11.1.3 Where a Playing Entity has more than one fixture scheduled across its teams in a Championships on a given day, they are not permitted to concede a walkover for a higher ranked team while continuing to field one or more lower ranked teams on the same day. For example, a Playing Entity may not concede a walkover at second team level, while continuing to field their third and fifth teams on the same day. Matches fulfilled in contravention of this regulation will be awarded to the opposition, or where both teams are in contravention, be voided.

REG 11.1.3.1 For possible exceptions to REG 11.1.3 due to 'Ring Fencing' of teams, refer to REG 11.1.5.

REG 11.1.3.2 Involuntary walkovers may be granted if applied for in accordance with walkover regulations in REG 13 meaning that REG 11.1.3 would be suspended in some instances, for example on health and safety grounds. Application to suspend REG 11.1.3 must be made to the BUCS Executive in advance of affected fixtures.

REG 11.1.3.3 REG 11.1.3 will not apply where a walkover has been conceded as a result of a Playing Entity being instructed by the BUCS Judiciary or as the outcome of a National Governing Body disciplinary matter that the team has been banned from fulfilling specific fixtures or for a specific period time that could result in them conceding walkovers.

Wording of REG 11.1.3 updated to clarify that it only relates to walkovers and not matches that are left to go void or agreed to be rescheduled (even if after the match date). For example, if an institution is struggling to field all of their teams on a particular date, they can try and reschedule the highest ranked team's fixture, they are not obliged to have to start by trying to reschedule the lowest ranked team's fixture.

Circumstance in which a fixture fulfilled in contravention might be deemed void limited and clarified to be only where both teams are in contravention.

REG 11.1.3.3 added to enable the BUCS Judiciary and/or National Governing Body disciplinary processes (where applicable) to be able to ban a specific team from fulfilling specific fixtures, or for a specific period time that could result in them conceding walkovers, without it having an unintended knock-on impact on the ability of any lower ranked teams to fulfil their fixtures.



REG 11.2

REG 11.2 Team sheets

REG 11.2.1 For all fixtures, teams are required to complete and have the opposition verify (approve or dispute) a team sheet prior to the match starting.

REG 11.2.2 Team sheets should be completed and verified on BUCS Play in accordance with REG 11.2.3-11.2.9. However, should it not be possible for this process to be completed on BUCS Play prior to the match starting, for example there is no Wi-Fi or mobile phone reception at the venue, then the teams should follow the process of REG 11.2.10. All teams are advised to carry with them at least two hard copies of the BUCS Team Sheet Pro Forma (Appendix 7) so that they are adequately prepared for any such scenario. **REG 11.2.3** The overriding principle should always be to complete fixtures. If issues are identified that a team may wish to appeal against (REG 15), they should 'dispute' their opposition's team sheet as detailed in these regulations and complete a Playing Under Protest Form as outlined in REG 12. **REG 11.2.4** Each team is responsible for ensuring that all individuals they wish to represent them are selected for the fixture and listed on the match team sheet on BUCS Play.

REG 11.2.5 To enable verification that the individuals representing the team are those listed on the team sheet, all individuals are required to provide photographic identification. Such identification will ideally take the form of a valid student card for their institution.

REG 11.2.6 The two teams should review the list of names on their opposition's match team sheet and cross-reference these with the individual photographic identification provided by each member of the team, whilst also checking that the individuals present match the IDs they have provided.

REG 11.2.7 If either captain finds that any

REG 11.2 Team sheets

REG 11.2.1 For all fixtures, teams are required to complete and have their opposition verify a team sheet prior to the match starting.

REG 11.2.2 Team sheets should be completed and verified on BUCS Play. However, should it not be possible for this process to be completed on BUCS Play prior to the match starting, for example there is no Wi-Fi or mobile phone reception at the venue, then paper team sheets can be used. Where paper team sheets are used there must be in some form a minimum of two copies of the team sheet, one for the home team to retain and one for the away team to retain (note REG 11.2.8). Each team is responsible for the correct completion and retention of their own copy. All teams are advised to carry with them at least two hard copies of the BUCS Team Sheet Pro Forma (Appendix 7) so that they are adequately prepared for any such scenario. If a team does not have a BUCS Team Sheet Pro Forma with them, any equivalent paperwork used/produced must capture the following essential information:

• Fixture information (Sport, league/knockout competition name, date and time of fixture, venue, home team name, away team name)

 The names of all team members being fielded are listed (and only the names of team members being fielded)

 Any individuals with a medical exemption authorised by their Athletic Union (or equivalent) as per REG 11.1.4

REG 11.2.3 Each team is responsible for ensuring that all team members they are fielding are listed on the team sheet. No other individuals should be listed.

REG 11.2.4 To enable verification that the individuals present and representing the team are those listed on the team sheet, all individuals are required to provide photographic identification.

The previously separate regulations covering completion and verification of teams sheets on BUCS Play and those covering the use of paper team sheets have been merged and streamlined to make the regulations easier to follow.

Old REG 11.2.8/REG 11.2.10.7 removed as considered that not something done much anymore and such a list can become out-of-date as soon as created and doesn't offer much more assurance than not seeing such a list at the fixture.

Clarity added that the only individuals named on a team sheet should be those being fielded and no-one else, to ensure that team sheets are an accurate representation of those actually being fielded.

Clarity added regarding disputing a blank team sheet on BUCS Play if the opposition team refuse or are unable to complete it and do not complete a paper team sheet.

Regulations updated to reflect that fact that potential breaches of REG 4 and REG 11.1.2.1–REG 11.1.2.4 can be reported outside of the match appeals process, for which it is not a requirement for a team to have played under protest or disputed a team sheet in order for their institution/Playing Entity to submit, but noting that their doing so can help validate any such report.

REG 11.2.8 It is advised, to avoid the need for verification post-fixture, that teams should take to all fixtures a list of individuals, including copies of individual photographic identification, that has been verified by their Athletic Union (or equivalent) as showing only individuals who meet the eligibility requirements of both their institution/Playing Entity and REG 4. This list must capture the following information regarding the Athletic Union (or equivalent) representative that has verified the identification: Position, name (printed), signature, and date of verification. Responsibility shall sit with the Athletic Union (or equivalent) to ensure that this list remains valid and correct as the season progresses, making any amendments as required.

REG 11.2.9 Once a captain has checked the opposition's team sheet and followed the above steps, they must either 'approve' or 'dispute' the team sheet on BUCS Play. Any captain disputing a team sheet must correctly complete a Playing

Verification should then be sought post-fixture with the appropriate Athletic Union (or equivalent) representative(s). All teams are advised to carry with them at least two hard copies of the BUCS Team Sheet Pro Forma (Appendix 7) so that they are adequately prepared for any such scenario. If a team does not have a BUCS Team Sheet Pro Forma with them, any equivalent paperwork used/produced must meet the requirements of REG 11.2.10.3.

REG 11.2.10.1 The overriding principle should always be to complete fixtures. If issues are identified that a team may wish to appeal against (REG 15), they should 'dispute' their opposition's team sheet as detailed in these regulations and complete a Playing Under Protest Form as outlined in REG 12.

REG 11.2.10.2 There must be in some form a minimum of two copies of the team sheet, one for the home team to retain and one for the away team to retain (note REG 11.2.10.8). Each team is responsible for the correct completion and retention of their own copy.

REG 11.2.10.3 Team sheets must be completed and verified before the match starts, including being signed by both captains (and recording the time of signing). The following essential information must be captured on each team sheet:

- Fixture information (Sport, league/knockout competition name, date and time of fixture, venue, home team name, away team name)
- Names of team members (Each team is responsible for ensuring that all individuals they wish to represent them are listed on the team

REG 11.2.8 Where paper team sheets have been used, following the fixture, each team should return their copy of the team sheet to their Athletic Union (or equivalent) who will then be responsible for transferring this information to BUCS Play and either 'approving' or 'disputing' the team sheet depending on whether any issues were raised. All paper team sheets must be retained and available upon request until 31 July of the respective season. **REG 11.2.9** All institutions/Playing Entities should be adhering to the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR). Paper team sheets should be retained for an institution/Playing Entity's records (note REG 11.2.8), and if required submitted to opposition Athletic Unions (or equivalent) or BUCS for verification and must be kept securely in line with current data protection regulations. Should BUCS request a copy, the data provided on the team sheet will be used in line with BUCS' Privacy Policy. REG 11.2.10 Should team sheets be required postfixture to resolve a match appeal (REG 15) or investigate a report of a potential breach of REG 4 or REG 11.1.2.1-REG 11.1.2.4 and an Athletic Union (or equivalent) be unable to provide adequate records to meet the

REG 11.2.10.4 To enable verification that the individuals representing the team are those listed on the team sheet, all individuals are required to provide photographic identification. Such identification will ideally take the form of a valid student card for their institution.

REG 11.2.10.5 The two teams should review the list of names of their opposition's team members on the team sheet and cross-reference these with the individual photographic identification provided by each member of the team, whilst also checking that the individuals present match the IDs they have provided.

REG 11.2.10.6 If either captain finds that any individuals on the opposition team are unable to provide identification, or otherwise has any concerns over their eligibility, they should complete a Playing Under Protest Form (REG 12) detailing any grievances as well as noting on the team sheet the individual(s) unable to be verified.

Where individuals are unable to provide identification, time and date stamped photographs should be taken on the day of any individual(s) in question. Any individual refusing to have their photograph taken should be noted on the Playing Under Protest Form. Verification should then be sought post-fixture with the appropriate Athletic Union (or equivalent) representative(s).

REG 11.2.10.6.1 Photographs taken in accordance

REG 11.2.11 Institutions/Playing Entities not completing team sheets adequately will be subject to sanctions by BUCS as detailed in Appendix 11 ('BUCS Disciplinary Sanction Guidelines') and in these regulations. Checks will be conducted by the BUCS Executive throughout the season to monitor compliance, with specific correlating sanctions for breaches identified through these checks as follows:

REG 11.2.11.1 Spot Checks The BUCS Executive will undertake spot checks on individual teams' team sheets throughout the season. A team will not be spot checked after their league's results submission deadline has passed. If any breaches are found then the following sanctions will be applied to the team:

- 1-2 missing/incomplete team sheet(s) written warning from BUCS.
- 3 missing/incomplete team sheets a one-point deduction in their league competition.
- 4+ missing/incomplete team sheets a three-point deduction in their league competition.
 Any missing/incomplete knockout competition or playoff team sheets will not count towards the above sanctions, but teams not correctly completing team sheets for knockout competition or playoff matches could still face consequences such as not being able to appeal or losing appeals because of this.

REG 11.2.11.2 Issues raised through appeals/by other institutions If the BUCS Executive become aware of missing/incomplete team sheets, either through a BUCS Match Appeals Process or via a report from another institution, then sanctions will be applied. Any issues to be raised must be lodged with the BUCS Executive prior to the respective league results submission deadline for a team, unless being raised as part of a match appeal which is in progress or for which an appeal submission or response deadline extension has been granted. If

A scan or photograph of the team sheet can also be uploaded to evidence the original hard copy. All hard copy team sheets must be retained and available upon request until the official BUCS season close each year. The date of the BUCS season close will be the first day of BUCS

REG 11.2.11.3 End of Season Review The BUCS Executive will undertake a review of team sheet compliance on a team-by-team basis. Institutions with teams found to have completed less than 60% of their league team sheets throughout the season, will incur a £100 fine per team, capped at a maximum of £500. As part of this check, the BUCS Executive will not retrospectively apply any sanctions which would have been imposed for missing/incomplete team sheets if found during the season.

REG 11.2.11.4 For the purposes of REG 11.2.11.1-REG 11.2.11.3, an "incomplete team sheet" shall be one which has named on it less than the minimum number of participants required to start the fixture as per the Sport Specific Regulations. However, teams should be complying with REG 11.2.3 and ensuring that all team members they are fielding (and no other individuals) are listed on the team sheet for each fixture.

REG 11.2.10.10 Data protection All

institutions/Playing Entities should be adhering to the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR). Hard copy team sheets should be retained for your institution/Playing Entity's records (note REG 11.2.10.9), and if required submitted to opposition Athletic Unions (or equivalent) or BUCS for verification and must be kept securely in line with current data protection regulations. Should BUCS request a copy, the data provided on the team sheet will only be used for the specific purpose of individual eligibility and team selection verification and used in line with BUCS' Privacy Policy.

REG 11.2.11 A team not completing the steps of REG 11.2.1-REG 11.2.9/REG 11.2.10 adequately cannot appeal in this regard. The Playing Under Protest and appeal regulations apply – as soon as a grievance is noted before or during a fixture a Playing Under Protest Form must be completed immediately. Only when adequate steps have been taken and a grievance comes to light post-fixture is an appeal valid without a Playing Under Protest Form.

REG 11.2.12 Should team sheets be required post-fixture to resolve a dispute and an Athletic Union (or equivalent) be unable to provide adequate records to meet the request, they shall automatically lose any correlating appeal and may face further disciplinary action.

REG 11.2.13 Institutions/Playing Entities not completing team sheets adequately will be subject to sanctions by BUCS as detailed in Appendix 11 ('BUCS Disciplinary Sanction Guidelines') and in these regulations. Checks will be conducted by the BUCS Executive throughout the season to monitor compliance, with specific correlating sanctions for breaches identified through these checks as follows:

REG 11.2.13.1 Spot Checks The BUCS Executive



will undertake spot checks on individual teams' team sheets throughout the season. A team will not be spot checked after their league's results submission deadline has passed. If any breaches are found during spot checks, then the following sanctions will be applied to the team:

- 1-2 missing/incomplete team sheet(s) written warning from BUCS.
- 3 missing/incomplete team sheets a one-point deduction in their league competition.
- 4+ missing/incomplete team sheets a threepoint deduction in their league competition. Any missing/incomplete knockout competition team sheets will not count towards the above sanctions, but teams not correctly completing team sheets for knockout competition matches could still face consequences such as not being able to appeal or losing appeals because of this. **REG 11.2.13.2** Issues raised through appeals/by other institutions If the BUCS Executive become aware of missing/incomplete team sheets, either through a BUCS Match Appeals Process or via a report from another institution, then sanctions will be applied. Any issues to be raised must be lodged with the BUCS Executive prior to the respective league results submission deadline for a team, unless being raised as part of a match appeal which is in progress or for which an appeal submission or response deadline extension has been granted. If any breaches are found during spot checks, then the following sanctions will be applied to the team:
- 1-2 missing/incomplete team sheet(s) written warning from BUCS.
- 3 missing/incomplete team sheets a one-point deduction in their league competition.
- 4+ missing/incomplete team sheets a threepoint deduction in their league competition.
 Any missing/incomplete knockout competition team sheets will not count towards the above

REG 14.3.1 When rearranging a postponed, late postponed or abandoned league match, the host institution/Playing Entity (as determined by REG 14.1/REG 14.2) must offer at least two dates in writing for the match to take place, in accordance with the relevant league deadline date as identified in Appendix 2 ('BUCS Leagues and Knockouts - Dates and Deadlines'), no later than 48 hours (allowing for weekends and Bank Holidays) after the scheduled start time of the match. One of these dates must be a weekend date and one a weekday date and they must avoid other prescheduled BUCS fixtures for both teams. If the opposition institution/Playing Entity can show that their team have another prescheduled BUCS fixture on BUCS Play on any of the dates offered, an alternative date must be provided by the host institution/Playing Entity for each instance before progressing to REG 14.3.2. Where the host institution/Playing Entity has failed to adhere to this regulation, they will be deemed to have conceded the match, and the opposition institution/Playing Entity will be awarded a walkover.

Entity's team cannot fulfil any of the dates offered by the host institution/Playing Entity under REG 14.3.1, they must offer two alternative dates no later than 48 hours (allowing for weekends and Bank Holidays) following receipt of the dates from the host institution/Playing Entity. One of these dates must be a weekend date and one a weekday date and must avoid other prescheduled BUCS fixtures for both teams. If the host institution/Playing Entity can show that their team have another prescheduled BUCS fixture on BUCS Play on either of the dates offered, an alternative

date must be provided by the opposition

REG 14.3.1 When rearranging a postponed, late postponed or abandoned league match, the host institution/Playing Entity (as determined by REG 14.1/REG 14.2) must offer one weekend date and one weekday date in writing for the match to take place, in accordance with the relevant league deadline date as identified in Appendix 2 ('BUCS Leagues and Knockouts - Dates and Deadlines'), no later than 48 hours (allowing for weekends and Bank Holidays) after the scheduled start time of the match. These dates must avoid any prescheduled BUCS fixtures for either team. If the opposition institution/Playing Entity can show that their team have a prescheduled BUCS fixture on BUCS Play on a date offered, an alternative date must be provided by the host institution/Playing Entity for each instance before progressing to REG 14.3.2. Where the host institution/Playing Entity has failed to adhere to this regulation, the opposition institution/Playing Entity shall be entitled to claim a walkover.

REG 14.3.1.1 If it is not possible to offer both a weekend date and a weekday date, due to there being no such dates remaining before the deadline on which neither team has a prescheduled BUCS fixture, but it is still possible to offer either one weekend date or one weekday date, then an institution/Playing Entity offering one such date and otherwise in compliance with the requirements of REG 14.3.1 shall be deemed to have adhered to the regulation.

REG 14.3.1.2 If it is not possible to offer either a weekend date or a weekday date, due to there being no such dates remaining before the deadline on which neither team has a prescheduled BUCS fixture, the fixture shall be declared void with no points being awarded to either side.

REG 14.3.1 amended so that the host is to only offer two dates. If they offer more, this can result in other steps, such as REG 14.3.4 then not being possible to use. If they offer more than two, the first weekday date and the first weekend date they have written shall be taken as their two dates.

Wording of REG 14.3.1 and REG 14.3.2 generally streamlined.

Where a lack of compliance with REG 14.3.1 or REG 14.3.2 would lead to a walkover, this has been updated to state that a walkover can be claimed, rather than that it will be awarded. This makes it clear how REG 13.7 and sub-regulations in relation to appealing against the walkover or applying for it to be considered involuntary would apply.

REG 14.3.1.1. REG 14.3.1.2. If neither institution/Playing Entity can fulfil the chosen date, both shall concede a walkover. If one institution/Playing Entity can fulfil the chosen date, they shall be awarded a walkover.

REG 14.3.5 Should the institutions/Playing Entities agree there are substantiated reasons why no rearrangement of a fixture can be made (such as no free dates remain in calendar), they may apply to the BUCS Executive to have the match declared a void fixture. Consideration will be on a case-by-case basis.

REG 14.3.6 Once a date has been chosen the host institution/Playing Entity must update this on BUCS Play.
