The one-weekend championships will take place at **Slazenger Padel Leeds North** across the weekend of **9–10 May 2026**.

This brand-new BUCS Championship brings competitive padel to the higher education stage in a big way. The event will feature Men's and Women's competitions, with teams made up of two to three players, giving institutions the flexibility to include one reserve player.

In future seasons, both parties will explore the potential introduction of a Mixed competition depending on the demand and growth of the sport across the Higher Education sector.

UK PADEL is a leading force in the development and promotion of padel tennis across the United Kingdom. With a mission to make padel accessible to all, UK PADEL champions sustainable growth through quality infrastructure, innovative programming and a strong community spirit. Brothers-in-law Nick Baker and Neil Percival came up with the idea of UK PADEL when the world was coming out of the COVID-19 lockdown and participation in outdoor sports was both permitted and encouraged. UK PADEL was formed in December 2020, with its first site opening at Holmer Green Sports Association in Buckinghamshire.

It operates four padel venues: Newquay (Cornwall), plus High Wycombe, Princes Risborough and Stoke Poges (all in Buckinghamshire), with 12,000 players registered across its clubs and two more clubs to be announced imminently.

It is the leading UK operator of padel tournaments across the nation, running padel championships from national schools age categories, universities championships and inter-county championships through to the Master series and Four Nations Cup.

It promotes the sport digitally, producing digital content and live streams of events, providing critically important community engagement for padel enthusiasts and fans. And it creates opportunities for brands to get in front of the rapidly expanding and attractive padel demographic through sponsorship and brand partnerships.
