

# BUCS BADMINTON REGULATIONS

PUBLISHED | 1 SEPTEMBER 2019 (UPDATED 22 OCTOBER 2019)



**BAD i** The BUCS Badminton Championships shall be conducted in accordance with the following BUCS sport specific regulations, the BUCS general regulations, and the Badminton England Regulations for Tournaments. Further event specific requirements, rules, and regulations will be contained within the entry and pre-event information for each Championship.

**BAD ii** In the event that these regulations contradict the BUCS general regulations, these BUCS sport specific regulations will supersede, unless specifically stated otherwise.

**BAD iii** In the event that these regulations contradict those of the Badminton England Regulations for Tournaments, these BUCS sport specific regulations will supersede, unless specifically stated otherwise.

**BAD iv** In the event that the BUCS general regulations contradict those of the Badminton England Regulations for Tournaments, the BUCS general regulations will supersede, unless specifically stated otherwise.

**BAD 1 Championships** BUCS will host annually the following Championships:

**BAD 1.1 Individual Championships** The programme shall include the events listed in Appendix 1 ('BUCS Competition Offer and Associated BUCS Points'), subject to entry numbers.

**BAD 1.2 Team Championships** The programme shall include leagues and knockout competitions as per BUCS general regulations, Appendix 1 ('BUCS Competition Offer and Associated BUCS Points') and Appendix 10 ('BUCS Promotion, Relegation and Knockout Information').

## Individual Championships

**BAD 2 Tournament structure and entries** See Appendix 1 ('BUCS Competition Offer and Associated BUCS Points') for all competitions offered as part of the BUCS Badminton Individual Championships. All competition specific event information will be available in the event entry information and pre-event information.

**BAD 3 Disputes at events** In line with REG 7.7, should a dispute occur at an event, the event appeal panel for Badminton shall comprise of the Tournament Director and a BUCS Staff Member.

## Team Championships

**BAD 4** There shall be separate Team Championships for Men and Women.

**BAD 4.1** For Scottish Conference (Tier 1 and below) league fixtures, and Scottish Conference Cup fixtures, Men's and Women's teams shall play as combined mixed teams.

**BAD 4.1.1** Teams in the Scottish Conference Tier 1 league shall play as separate gender teams for the Men's and Women's Trophy knockout competitions that run alongside the league programme.

**BAD 4.1.2** Teams in the Scottish Tier 1 league shall have results extracted from the Men's singles and doubles, and the Women's singles and doubles, to establish which Men's and Women's teams shall be eligible for the relevant Premier Tier promotion process.

**BAD 5 Match format** Each match shall consist of four doubles rubbers and four singles rubbers as follows:

- Singles 1v1, 2v2, 1v2 and 2v1
- Doubles 1v1, 2v2, 1v2 and 2v1

**BAD 5.1** For Scottish Conference (Tier 1 and below) league fixtures, and Scottish Conference Cup fixtures, each match shall consist of eight doubles rubbers and four singles rubbers as follows:

- Men's Singles 1v1 and 2v2
- Women's Singles 1v1 and 2v2
- Men's Doubles 1v1 and 2v2
- Women's Doubles 1v1 and 2v2
- Mixed Doubles 1v1, 2v2, 3v3 and 4v4

## **BAD 6 Fixture administration and arrangements**

### **BAD 6.1 Court bookings**

**BAD 6.1.1** A minimum of two Courts for three hours MUST be provided for all league and knockout fixtures.

**BAD 6.1.1.1** For Scottish Conference (Tier 1 and below) league fixtures, and Scottish Conference Cup fixtures, a minimum of four Courts for three hours MUST be provided.

**BAD 6.1.2** Failure to book the minimum prescribed above will result in the home team forfeiting any rubbers not completed should the match not be finished.

**BAD 6.1.3** The court specifications are specified by the BWF (Badminton World Federation) Laws of Badminton as well as the design guidelines published by Sport England and Badminton England.

**BAD 6.2 Order of play** The order of play for each match shall be as follows (home team placings first):

- Singles 1v2
- Singles 2v1
- Doubles 1v2
- Doubles 2v1
- Singles 1v1
- Singles 2v2
- Doubles 1v1
- Doubles 2v2

**BAD 6.2.1** For Scottish Conference (Tier 1 and below) league fixtures, and Scottish Conference Cup fixtures, the order of play for each match shall be as follows (home team placings first):

- Men's and Women's Singles 1v1
- Men's and Women's Singles 2v2
- Men's and Women's Doubles 1v1
- Men's and Women's Doubles 2v2
- Mixed Doubles 1v1
- Mixed Doubles 2v2
- Mixed Doubles 3v3
- Mixed Doubles 4v4

### **BAD 6.3 Players**

**BAD 6.3.1** Teams shall consist of six players, competing as two singles players and two doubles pairs. A player cannot play singles and doubles during the same match.

**BAD 6.3.1.1** Teams unable to field enough players to fulfil at least four rubbers, must concede a walkover. Teams fielding at least this minimum requirement, but not a full team, shall concede the rubbers they are unable to fulfil.

**BAD 6.3.1.2** Where an institution/Playing Entity has multiple teams playing on the same day, the fixtures of the higher team(s) must be prioritised from the top down when fulfilling teams. E.g. An institution/Playing Entity cannot send only three/four/five players for their 1<sup>st</sup> team, whilst also putting out a full 2<sup>nd</sup> team.

**BAD 6.3.1.3** For Scottish Conference (Tier 1 and below) league fixtures, and Scottish Conference Cup fixtures, teams shall consist of eight players, comprising of a maximum of four men and four women. Two men and two women will play singles, all four men and four women will play doubles.

**BAD 6.3.1.3.1** Teams unable to field enough players to fulfil at least six rubbers, must concede a walkover. Teams fielding at least this minimum requirement, but not a full team, shall concede the rubbers they are unable to fulfil.

**BAD 6.3.2** The singles players and doubles pairs shall all be ranked in order of playing strength.

## **BAD 7 Team selection/Ranking lists**

**BAD 7.1** All institutions/Playing Entities with teams in Premier Tier leagues must submit the names of four players who are unable to play below the first team, no later than the deadline in the BUCS Sport Specific Affiliations Document. Failure to submit this information will result in sanctions being imposed as outlined in the BUCS Sport Specific Affiliations Document and the possibility of further disciplinary action. **This ranking information will be available [here](#) for ease of reference.**

**BAD 7.1.1** Players included on the BUCS Badminton ranking list may only play for the first team and not in any lower tiered teams.

**BAD 7.1.2** Players not included on the BUCS Badminton ranking list may play in the first team, providing adherence to REG 11.1.

**BAD 7.1.3** Teams found to be attempting to manipulate the rankings will face disciplinary action under REG 5.

## **BAD 8 Scoring system**

**BAD 8.1** The BWF (Badminton World Federation) Laws of Badminton shall be used including the Rally Point Scoring System, except as stated below:

**BAD 8.1.1** Each match shall be the best of three games of 21 points except that if the score reaches 20-20 the winner is then the player/pair with two clear points or whose score reaches 30 first.

**BAD 8.1.2** Play shall be continuous from the first service until the end of the match. There shall be NO intervals when a side reaches 11 points in a game, NOR between the first and second games, NOR between the second and third games.

**BAD 8.1.3** Only when the shuttle is not in play, shall a player be permitted to receive advice during a match.

**BAD 8.2** The team winning the majority of rubbers shall be the match winner.

**BAD 8.3** In the event of a tie on rubbers in a league fixture, the match shall be considered a draw.

**BAD 8.4** In the event of a draw in a knockout fixture, the winner shall be determined as follows:

**BAD 8.4.1** The team winning the highest number of games. If a tie still results;

**BAD 8.4.2** The team with the greatest difference between points won and points lost. If a tie still results;

**BAD 8.4.3** The team winning the highest number of games in the 1v1 singles and 1v1 doubles rubbers. If a tie still results;

**BAD 8.4.4** The team with the greatest difference between points won and points lost in 1v1 singles and 1v1 doubles rubbers. If a tie still results;

**BAD 8.4.5** The BUCS Executive will toss a coin to decide the outcome of a fixture.

**BAD 8.4.6** In the event of a rubber having to be conceded through injury, the points already won by both teams will stand, with the team that did not concede also gaining the points that they would need to win the rubber.

**BAD 9 Scorecards** Institutions/Playing Entities are required to maintain accurate records\* of the matches played by their teams in case of a tie on points within a league which requires additional score information to that on BUCS Play. In such circumstances, the BUCS Executive will contact the relevant institutions/Playing Entities for details of all their league matches in order to separate the teams.

\* 'Accurate records' are taken to mean precise details of all aspects of the fixture including rubbers, games and points; won and lost.

**BAD 10 Incomplete fixtures**

**BAD 10.1** In the event of a fixture being incomplete due to a late start, with a team at fault, their opposition may claim any rubbers not completed or unplayed.

**BAD 10.2** In the event of a fixture being incomplete due to an institution/Playing Entity booking insufficient court time, their opposition may claim any rubbers not completed or unplayed.

**BAD 11 Shuttlecocks** An appropriate number of new, tournament quality feather shuttlecocks of the correct speed must be supplied by the home team for use in all matches.
