

LOCAL RULES

1. OUT OF BOUNDS (Rule 18.3)

- a. Marked by white stakes.
- b. Over and boundary.
- c. Into or over the footpath between 9th and 10th holes.
- d. The Clubhouse

2. PENALTY AREAS (Rule 17)

a. Marked by red stakes

3. ABNORMAL COURSE CONDITIONS (INCLUDING IMMOVABLE OBSTRUCTIONS)

Marked by blue stakes/lines – note some areas request a compulsory pick and drop.

Drop freely within one club-length of the nearest point of relief not nearer the hole.

- a. GROUND UNDER REPAIR
 - Marked by blues stakes/lines. Where defined as no-play zones in GUR(Rule 16.1f) it is compulsory to take relief.
- b. SPRINKLER HEADS
 - All pop-up sprinkler heads are immovable obstructions and relief may be taken under Rule 16.1b. Additionally, a player may take relief if the sprinkler head is on the line of play and is within 2 club lengths of the purring green and within 2 club lengths of the ball.
- c. PROTECTION OF YOUNG TREES
 - Players must take relief from tress which are less than 2 clubs in height, staked or have a soil bund (Rule 16.1)
- d. All paths and deep tractor tracks are obstructions and relief is available under Rule 16.1.

4. INTEGRAL PARTS OF THE COURSE

Walls supporting teeing areas and steps to teeing areas, and concrete steps and patio up to the clubhouse are all integral parts of the course and relief is only available under penalty (Rule 19.1)

5. SINGLE PLAYERS

May only play one ball.

HEALTH AND SAFETY

One prolonged Klaxon note means that you must stop playing immediately and return to the clubhouse. Do not take shelter on the course.

Two short Klaxon notes means that play may be resumed.
